The 2016/17 season has been outstanding in performance and exactly what we need and expect of our Club Nippers, Patrolling members, competitors, social members and supporters. To our Sponsors as always we owe a huge debt of thanks to keep the doors open and the lights on. One major sponsor the RACV has this year transferred the \$150,000 sponsorship secured in 2013 into our account and we can now get on with the building renovations and repairs desperately

needed. We have established a Building Committee that is busy finalising priorities of renovation designs and maintenance to keep our Clubhouse capable of handling the pressures of a growing population each year. With Torquay's population in 2006 at 6695 it has grown at approx 1000 people per year to now stand at approximately 15,000 so the pressure on our beaches is not going to let up. By 2040 the Surf Coast Shire expects the population of Torquay to sit between 25-30,000. This is a warning that the Club must keep up with the demand being put on our services which will only grow immensely in the near future. This along with more compliance demands and the introduction of mandatory WWC checks for all senior members the legislative requirements of running a Club of our size is ever demanding.

The Club finances are in a solid position which is represented in the financial report and I commend the Club Committee on being responsible with the member's funds towards the fine balance of required expenditure, members wants and needs and maintaining a positive profit and loss statement on behalf of all members. This has been bolstered by the fantastic job done by our Marketing Director and Functions Director securing good numbers of sponsorship dollars and functions income.

As a summary the Club is in a good financial position, member numbers are steady, we have provided our primary service of keeping our beaches safe with pride, vigilance and service and the Nippers are smiling keeping us proud of the future to come.

To the Committee members I thank you all for your dedication and service to the Club and its members.

To the members I thank you all for your loyalty to our great Club and I thank the Club for all that it has and continues to give me.

Club Captain – Tony WHITE

The Club Captain's job description specifically includes responsibility for the lifesaving protocol with LSV which is our commitment to patrolling for the season. I am pleased to report that in an environment where people have an exponentially increasing number of other activities to choose from, we filled all our patrols. Last year we won most improved and regional winner for our patrol audits and as one of the regional auditors I can honestly say that our patrolling standards are as high as any in the region and given that one club I audited had defaulted on more than ten patrols this season our relative performance is excellent.

We had more than 1000 new awards or qualifications achieved this season. This is remarkable. The good work of the likes of Pat Spinazzola, Georgia Atherton-King, Zoe Spriggs, Ashley Dubberley, Jayden Ham and Steve Christofi amongst many others, meant that we had a bunch of eager young trainers at our biggest bronze camp for years and that bronze camp included young asylum seekers from the Congo, Vietnam, Myanmar, Sri Lanka and Vietnam as well as a large group of physio students some of whom have already gone on to gain extra awards. The camp and other awards could not have proceeded without the perennial Keith Millar commitment to training them as well as a range of assessors who we regularly rely on like Dr Bill Johnson.

This year I achieved my official's qualification and officiated my first carnival. It taught me valuable lessons about keeping in mind that by and large our sports are kids sports, run by volunteers and we all have a duty to make sure that we and our club mates don't lose sight of that. But I cannot hold a candle to the likes of Brian Hayden, Bill Johnson and Peter Doyle amongst many others who travelled all over the state to officiate and without whom our competitors could not compete. Thanks also to our water safety and IRB crews who gave up weekends to make sure that we filled our water safety commitments.

Inevitably the Club Captain gets called into assist, with other members of the executive, in dealing with the very few, but inevitable, disputes and niggles that occur within a club approaching 900 members. Every year there will always be some niggles or another and there are members, life members, older than me who have dealt with plenty of them, but we will resolve these niggles

better if we remember some key things, we are a lifesaving organization, we need the goodwill of the public to survive, we need the goodwill of the government to occupy the crown land we are on and buying a membership buys responsibilities more than it buys rights.

On some practical notes we resolved the funding agreement with the RACV and will now be working with them to ensure a lasting legacy for them and the club. We have officially commenced down the path to a new lease with GORRC, this will be issued when our current one runs out early next year.

We were successful in a range of grant applications for new gear including a new ATV but that purchase reminds us all that with a loss in value of around 50% in 10 months expensive gear necessarily stored a few metres from the ocean will go downhill fast unless we take good care of it.

We changed our operating model for the kiosk so that we weren't holding stock or employing people when no-one was on the beach and our corporate governance has improved significantly thanks to the work of Tiffany Quinlan and Katrina Spinazzola.

Finally I cannot let pass the opportunity to thank those who have made a great contribution over the last few years on the committee but are not going on. Any club would give their eyeteeth to have an Olympian such as Bryan Thomas to run their competition section and we were lucky to have him. Noel Dubberley as President and Tiffany Quinlan as Secretary gave up many hundreds of hours of time and income in their own businesses to do the work that no-one sees; the mountains of LSV and SLSA paperwork, copping the criticism from a handful of members for not having a bag of magic fairy dust to fix everything, the little but important things like helping to run a wake for a member of the community who died young and working through the adjustments necessary for a member with disabilities.

And finally Katrina White has done more financially and strategically for the club in the last two years than almost anyone. Katrina has professionalized our corporate hiring and purchasing and at the same time provided a service that many of our members use. Thanks to Katrina, Noel, Tiffany and Brian – you will be missed on the committee but hopefully we can still lean on you in the future when we need you.

Director of Lifesaving – Scott TANNAHILL

It is with pleasure that I present my first Annual report as the club's Director of Lifesaving. When I first started in the new role, it quickly became obvious that we were in serious trouble in that we were down to only 115 active members and also very low on advanced awards. So my first goal was to get as many new "Bronzies" as we possibly could and at the same time, get everyone motivated to up skill with new awards. It is so pleasing to report that the season saw a huge increase in our new awards gained. If it were not for the tireless efforts of our young Trainers and young at heart Assessors, we would not have recruited and trained so many.

Bronze Camp - During the early stages of planning, I set a target of 50 new members. As a precursor to the main Camp, we ran an Adult Bronze Course, which kicked the season off with up to 20 new awards gained. Following months of planning, our week long camp began. By weeks end, we had almost 60 new members.

Patrols - The first draft of the roster was to say the least, concerning. We were seriously down on required awards such as IRB, Advanced Resuscitation and Beach Management. We also had to find some new blood to take on the Patrol Captains roles.

By Christmas, we had recruited and training 60 new active members, Up skilled new ARTC, First Aid, Basic Beach Management and some IRB Awards. Our patrols were generally well attended. Typically, January saw large numbers signing on, in fact on a couple of occasions, we had over 20.

Another highlight was the introduction of the healthy lunches provided to our all day patrols. On behalf of our Patrol group, I extend appreciation to Woolworths Nth Torquay who provided over 20 Patrols with a healthy food option and a very special thank you to Fiona Billington for volunteering her time to gather the food from "Woolies" then make up the food packs. The continuous support of our Jack Harris Trust assisted with the club being able to purchase a new IRB, 2 new motors and a new Beach Vehicle. Because of this most valuable support, we are able to have reliable and state of the art equipment.

I believe this past Patrol season was a success, however there is a lot of work

to be done in the Off Season. We must continue to work on new awards, in particular IRB awards.

There are many to thank for making this another successful season and too many to list. Those of Special note are our Patrol Captains. Trainers. Assessors and Patrolling Members.

Liesel Fraser report

Director of Facilities - Ken GODFREY

This year has seen some well overdue repairs and improvements undertaken on the club. The club is in a state of constant deterioration due to weather and age and needs ongoing maintenance to ensure it is fit for purpose both in terms of safety and general usage. Whilst work was done this year the development of the building subcommittee and general review has uncovered many more items that need urgent attention. The RACV donation was a welcome injection of funds but as a club we will need to continue to raise more funds for capital works as the availability of grants for such work continues to be harder and harder to obtain.

Some of the work done during the season include:

- Laminex partitions that were previously ordered for men and ladies toilets downstairs and new toilet door to men's toilet off main hall are now installed.
- Windows to rear wall of bunkrooms have now been replaced with commercial grade aluminium windows at a cost of \$18,000. In achieving this job it became apparent that the existing roof was fully supported on the existing timber windows, a complete no no today, supporting beams were designed to carry this load.
- Replacement gatic cover has been installed to Club carpark to replace existing broken cover.
- Brick garden path has been re-laid to rear garden courtyard.
- Roller doors, two have been replaced to board shed and one replaced to nipper storage area.
- New locks fitted to three balcony doors of bunk room and doors adjusted.
- Hands free basin installed to downstairs Kiosk.
- New glass dishwasher installed to main hall bar area.
- Painting to hall toilets, shower room to men's and external face wall of Kiosk to remove graffiti, painted by Caretaker Damien Horan.
- Two new coin slots have been installed to men's showers at a cost of \$560 + GST each, hence the reason for the 20 cent charge per shower to assist in repair costs.

Marketing Director – Fleur BATTIES

In October 2016 I was honoured to take on the role of Marketing Director for Torquay Surf Life Saving Club. Having been a member of the marketing subcommittee since 2015 I was aware of the great work completed by my predecessor Sid Tass and ready to bring it to fruition.

The Marketing subcommittee goals for 2016/17 were to;

- raise our community profile to attract new members & sponsors
- create great relationships with our existing sponsors
- raise additional funds through existing and new sponsorships
- create opportunities for our members to be more connected

I can proudly say the club has pulled together and achieved all of these goals.

The marketing subcommittee kicked off the season with a very successful open day and stalls at the Cowrie market in October and November. This gave prospective members an opportunity to ask how they can become involved and join TSLSC on the spot. Historian's Report - Richard Greenhough

VALE

It is with deep regret that we record the death during the 'season' under review of the following members.

Malcolm (Acky) Atkinson

Malcolm, elected a Life Member 2nd August, 1987, passed away on the 27th June 2016, Age 81.

Mal joined Torquay SLSC in March 1956, gained his surf bronze on 8th April 1956 and soon became a member of the Senior Boat Crew. At the 1957 Victorian Titles crewing with Bill Booth, Billy Frost, Ray Pettigrove and John Pettigrove as sweep they gained second placing. This Senior Boat Crew went on to win the next 3 seasons Senior Victorian Boat Race Title and were placed second at the Australian Titles in 1957/58 (Geoff Seeley replaced Bill Booth in 1959/60). Mal retired from competition at the end of the 1959/60 season but came out of retirement in 1963/64. Mal rowed again for the "A" crew which was placed 3rd at the Victorian Titles and in the 1965/66 season Mal rowed in the 'C' crew. Mal held the position of Boat Vice Captain for 3 seasons from 1958 to 1961.

Mal was granted Active Reserve Membership in 1966. From the 1955/56 season to 1968/69 Mal was an Active member of the Club for 10 seasons missing 3 years of membership due to business and personal commitments. In 1969 Mal relinquished his membership.

In November, 1974 Mal re-joined the club as an Associate Member and from 1977 until 1987 took on a number of club committee positions:

- General Committee - 5 Seasons – 1977 to 1982
- Boat Captain - 5 Seasons – 1982 to 1987
- Bingo Co-ordinator – 3 Seasons – 1979 to 1982

Mal was an Associate member until the 1986/87 (13 season) when he was elected a Life Member of the club. Mal was a member for 50 seasons and was awarded a 50 Year Membership Medallion in 2016.

John Perillo

John passed away on the 11th October 2016, Age 63.

John joined Torquay SLSC as a Cadet Member during the 1965/66 season, gained his Bronze Medallion on 19th January 1969 and his Instructors Certificate during the 1972/73 season.

John's membership of the club totalled 31 seasons. He was an Active member of the club for 18 seasons competing in boat events. During this time John held the important position of Vice-Captain (Patrol Co-ordinator) for 2 seasons, 1972/73 and 1973/74. John was also the Delegate to State Centre in season 1972/73, General Committee 1975/76 and Club Booking Officer seasons 1976/77 and 1977/78. John was a great worker assisting where required – setting up gear and being in the duty boat for carnivals, club events and bronze exams.

John's membership lapsed after season 1982/83 and he then re-joined the club in season 1996/97.

It was during season 1996/97 that the Torquay Surf Life Saving Club Trust (Jack Harris Memorial) was formally set up. John was the driving force behind the setting up of the Trust arranging the Trust Deed, appropriate registration and many other matters. John took on the role as the Trust Secretary a position he held for 20 years.

Gary Carroll

Gary passed away on the 4th November 2016, Age 77.

Gary joined the club as an Associate Member during the 1990/91 season and has remained a member for the past 26 seasons.

Gary was a member who enjoyed the comradeship of the year round 'early morning' swim group - a time for a good chat with others and to solve the problems of the world.

Gladys Nicholls

Gladys passed away on the 21st November 2016, Age 89.

Gladys joined the club in season 1969/70 as a member of the Ladies Auxiliary and had remained a member for the past 57 years.

Prior to the formation of the Ladies Auxiliary in 1966 Gladys, like many ladies (wives, sisters or daughters of club members) had been assisting the club for many years. In Gladys case this being since 1947 when her brother Rex 'China' Gilbert joined TSLSC.

One such assistance to the club was when as secretary to Graham Patrick, she assisted in the staging of the International Surf Carnival held at Torquay as part of the 1956 Olympic Games. Graham Patrick was the club's Honorary Carnival's Organiser for the event that saw 70000 to 100,000 people on the Torquay Surf Beach over the two days of International and Australian Championships competition.

Gladys served on the Ladies Auxiliary Committee on a number of occasions 2 recorded positions being Vice Patron 1972/73 and Committee Member 1981/82 (sadly over a number of years Ladies Auxiliary Committee positions were not recorded).

Gladys, along with lifelong friends Judy Browne, Rita and Helen Black, Mary Joyce, Phyl Wall, Beryl Blewett, Esther Pittard, Mavis Bennett and many who followed as Ladies Auxiliary members raised many thousands of dollars for the club.

Auburn (Aub) Cherry

Auburn passed away on the 30th December 2016, Age 91.

Auburn joined Torquay in 1950 and gained his Bronze on 21st December 1950. In 1951 Auburn was elected the club's first Board and Ski Captain a position he held until the end of the 1955 season.

Auburn was placed second in the 1951 State and Club Board Titles and selected in the State Team that toured Tasmania that year. In 1953 Auburn was placed third at the State Titles and in January 1954 won the inaugural Novice Board Race at the Southern State Championships held at Torquay.

Auburn was an Active member of the club for 17 years and re-joined the club as an Associate for a further 5 years in the 1980's.

Peter Philp

Peter passed away on the 3rd January 2017, Age 71

Peter joined the club as a Cadet Member in season 1959/60 and gained his Bronze on 24th December 1961.

Peter competed for the club over a number of years as a swimmer winning or being placed in a number of club championships and other events. Peter was a member of the Junior Surf and R & R Teams that won the State Championship in 1962 and he was placed second in the Junior Belt at the 1963 Victorian Titles.

In club competition Peter gained first place in both the Junior Surf and Belt Championship in season 1961/62 season along with first placing in the Bob Noseworthy Memorial Surf Race and the Frank Trainor Easter Medley and second placing in the Point Score Competition (Frank Budge Shield). Season 1962/63 saw Peter second in both the Junior Surf Club Championship and the Frank Trainor Easter Medley. In Season 1964/65 Peter was Senior Club Surf Champion.

Peter was a member for 13 seasons but not continuous. Peter's final season of membership was season 1975/76.

Peter other sporting pursuit was lightweight rowing competing at school and club events before becoming a very successful international lightweight coach and a State and National selector.

Leslie Vokes

Leslie passed away on the 26th February 2017, Age 77

Leslie joined the club as a Ladies Auxiliary Member during the 1977/78 season During Leslie's 39 seasons as a member Leslie held a number of both Associate and club committee positions:

- Treasurer of Associates 85/86, 86/87, 87/88, 88/89, 89/90 (5 seasons)
- Assistant Club Secretary 86/87, 87/88, 88/89, 89/90 (4 seasons)
- Club Secretary 90/91, 91/92, 92/93, 93/94, (4 seasons)
- Associates Committee 97/98
- Secretary Associates 98/99

Leslie was twice awarded the President's Trophy - season 1987/88 and 1988/89

Leslie gave great assistance in the production of the Club's 50 Year History book – typing up all sections and producing computer disks for the book's printing.

K. Roy Fishley

Roy passed away on the 20th April 2017, Age 81.

Roy joined the club during the 1957/58 season and gained his Bronze on 22nd March 1959.

Roy was an active member for 12 season and held the position of Assistant Honorary Secretary for 4 seasons from the 1960/61 season and a General Committee member season 1964/65

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act (Victoria) 2012. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policy is consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated and has been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Fixed Assets

Property plant and equipment are included at their cost of acquisition or valuation. Assets are depreciated over their estimated useful life to the Club on a prime cost value basis. The following rates of depreciation are applied to Property, Plant and Equipment.

(b) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand, at Banks and on deposit.

(c) Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers. Membership revenue is recognised on a proportional basis based on the period of membership. Donations are recognised when monies are received.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value.

(e) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expenses. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.



INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF TORQUAY SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the financial report of Torquay Surf Life Saving Club Inc., which comprises the balance sheet as at 30 April 2017, and the income statement and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the statement by members of the committee.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report, the accompanying financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Torquay Surf Life Saving Club Inc. as at 30 April 2017 and its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements, and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

It is not practical for the Torquay Surf Life Saving Club Inc. to maintain an effective system of internal control over cash receipts until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to cash receipts was limited to amounts recorded.
