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




- 2 x NSW carnivals in January which again allowed us to compete at a high level outside of local carnivals and was an excellent lead into our final preparation for states and aussies.
- A refinement of our team selection process that encouraged greater and more impartial competition amongst members at carnivals

The fantastic results that were achieved by our members at local, state and national championships are mentioned elsewhere in this report but I hope all competitors take some time to think back and consider all the work that was done over the 10 month period to help get these results and the process that many had taken over 3-4 years to get to this point. It's when you look at the results from this perspective, that you can see the **real achievement**.

It would be unfair to try and mention all the helpers this season but I would like to recognise the work of the coaching team including Paul De Landre who has been instrumental in the development of competitors over the last few years and this season with the support of Rob McAllister and Damian Holman helped train a very enthusiastic group of nippers.

I was assisted all season by the great Brendan Garreau, Zeb Walsh, Simon Strahan, Anna Masek, Nick Muhlebach and Danny Hayden with support from Chris Porter to help guide the senior team in training and competition. I believe it was the way we worked together and our support of each other that enabled us to produce such a good program.

I think another major difference this season was the terrific support of our parents, many who volunteered to work as sectional managers on the beach at carnivals. Under the guidance of our dedicated team manager, Peter Hansen and with the logistical/help of Geoff Cole this group were invaluable and added to the professional approach of our team.


We were also lucky to have additional support from our directors, mainly through the vision and drive of our president Peter Robinson. I thank Peter for his leadership and support over many years.

The Masters and Torquay based A crew made the majority of finals in Open grade and, for the 7th year straight, came home from the Victorian Masters with a medal although not the colour they wanted.


Officially the season started on the first Sunday of December for the local kids and a lot of Melbournians making their way down the highway as well.

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Torquay Surf Life Saving Club Inc. (the Club) is incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981. This special purpose financial report has been prepared for distribution to the members to fulfil the Committee's financial reporting requirements under the Club's constitution.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of this report, as described below, are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Club's constitution and with previous years, and are in the opinion of the Committee, appropriate to meet the needs of members. The requirements of Australian Accounting Standards and other professional reporting requirements (UIG Consensus Views) do not have mandatory applicability to the Club because it is not a "reporting entity".

Basis of Preparation

The report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act 1981, and the following applicable Australian Accounting Standards and Urgent Issues Group Interpretations:

AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements;

 AASB 108: Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors;
 AASB 110: Events after the Balance Sheet Date;
 AASB 117: Leases;
 AASB 1031: Materiality.

No other Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

Reporting Basis and Conventions

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

Accounting Policies

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Income Tax

The association is income tax exempt.

(b) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and at call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months.





Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial report. (These policies do not require the application of all Accounting Standards and UIG Consensus Views).

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

QUALIFICATION

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for the Club to maintain an effective system of internal control over donations, subscriptions and other fund raising activities until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to fundraising was limited to amounts recorded.

Historians Report

Ken Pollard

During the course of last year (2006) Annual General Meeting, Mrs Wilma Pettigrove, Charles Lyne A.M. and Malcolm Atkinson were recipients of the clubs 40 year membership medallion. The following details give a brief outline of their years of service to the Torquay Surf Life Saving Club.

Wilma Pettigrove

Prior to joining the newly reformed Ladies Auxiliary in January 1966, Wilma had helped in the preparation of meals for the numerous functions held in the original clubhouse. This also included helping at a variety of fundraising activities during those early years. She served as Secretary, then Assistant Secretary and then as a member of the Ladies Auxiliary Committee for a three year period 1968-1971 then 1994 -1996 when husband John, was Club president. These two years included the celebration of the clubs 50th Anniversary, Victorian Championship Carnival (March 1996) and the Australian I.R.B. Championship April 1996.

Wilma also served as the Club booking officer for a record nine terms – 1987 to 1996 and with John, prepared and cooked meals for more than a dozen yearly live in Bronze Camp's at the clubhouse. For season 2002/03 Wilma, with husband John was awarded Best Club Person's trophy, and in 2005 she received a community commendation acknowledging her fifteen (15) years delivering "meal on wheels" for the Districts disabled and elderly citizens. In recognition of Wilma's work for TSLSC a surf boat donated by Mrs Christine Huber was named in her honour in January 2003.

Malcolm Atkinson

Mal joined in March 1956, gained his surf bronze, during April of the same year and quickly became a member of the senior boat crew. He and his fellow crew members, Bill Booth, Bill Frost, Ray Pettigrove and sweep, John Pettigrove were successful at many surf carnivals. The crew went onto win three consecutive State Titles 1958, 1959 & 60, and were placed 2nd in the Australian surf boat open championship in 1958. Mal retired at the end of 1959/60 season, but rowed again for the "A" crew in 1963/64 and the "C" crew in 1965/66.

Granted active reserve in 1966, Mal due to business and personal commitments relinquished his membership at the end of the year, rejoining as an Associate in November 1974.

His activities as a club official have included three (3) years Boat Vice Captain, five (5) years member of the General Committee, five (5) years Boat Captain. As convenor of the club "Bingo" for three (3) years, Mal helped raise many thousands of dollars for club funds.

For his many years of outstanding service he was elevated to Life Membership of our club in 1987.

Charles Lyne AM

The Torquay Surf Life Saving Club was indeed fortunate when at the ripe old age of 32, Chas joined our ranks in September 1965. Through he had been visiting Torquay for brief periods over many years circumstances had prevented him taking up membership. In the years prior to joining he had been an active member of the

North Rd, Bayside Club (a club which gave us some top grade trained lifesavers in the early years) where he had won many inter-club belt, and swim wade events.

He gained his surf bronze in November 1966 and quickly proved his worth. In the next three (3) years 1966/67, 67/68, 68/69, he was a member of the award winning best patrol, and was awarded the top patrolman trophy for Season 1968/69. There is no doubt that if he had joined at an earlier age he would have been a competent surf competitor.

Chas was elected to General Committee in 1967, then he was assistant secretary for the next two (2) years 1968/69, 69/70 – during those years he was very active in the formation of the "Nippers", plus the building and other sub-committees. Chas took over as Club President on 24 July 1970, soon after our clubhouse had been destroyed by fire. He held this position for the next three years. The rebuilding of our new clubhouse is a story on its own – see pages 71-74 club history book – suffice to say we were indeed fortunate to have a man of his calibre. The leadership qualities he showed, his dedication and encouragement were an inspiration to us all at a time which proved as difficult as any in our club's history.

He spent a further five years as Vice President, and then took office as club President again in 1978/79. During this term the last payment for the clubhouse rebuilding load was made. He then served a further five years as Vice President, giving him a total of seventeen (17) years as a club official.

For outstanding service over that long period, he was elected a Life Member in July 1981.

Charles's activities with Surf Lifesaving Victoria included, thirteen (13) years as President 1987-2000 elected Life Member of that controlling Body, 2001 awarded medal in Order of Australia for services to surf lifesaving, 1996 – elected Life Member of National Council 2003. (for further details of Charles impressive awards see page 26, 2003/04 club annual report.

We at Torquay can be justly proud of these three forty (40) year medal recipients, for their fine contribution to the achievement and history of the Torquay S.L.S.C.


