
## **EDUCATION NEWS**

They got the jump on us on Day 1 of competition, however over the last two days of competition they only drew ahead further by a mere 5 points to again finish in second spot in the overall points score.

We finished the carnival with 18 gold, 26 silver and 16 bronze medals as well placing between 4th and 6th on 32 occasions. This certainly helped our overall point score to keep ticking along during the two and half day carnival.

With the nippers also having a very successful State Titles this year, hopefully this is now the start of a long era of competition success for the Torquay SLSC. # "Gary doesn't just row boats": 'Gazza' christened at Torquay boat reveal

BOAT christenings at Torquay Surf Life Saving Club can be an emotional yet happy day and Sunday was no different.

Hundreds of members gathered in the club's rear courtyard to listen to speeches, take photos and christen the club's new \$30,000 crew boat sponsored by Torquay Hotel.



Members of all ages were there for the reveal of the newest addition to the boat ranks.

MC for the reveal, club captain Julian Sweeney, named the boat after member Gary "Gazza" Pettigrove for his long and effective tenure as a life member and integral role within the club since he joined in 1969.

Mr Pettigrove is the son of founding Torquay SLSC members John and Wilma Pettigrove and is also a recipient of the Wishart Medal, the top individual award that can be bestowed upon a Victorian life saver.

"It's a huge honour," Mr Pettigrove said postreveal. "My family has four boats named after them, it's a big deal for a single member to get one but to have four within our family, is just a massive honour. My parents were the 'gold star' people of this club and I was just another member within Torquay, but I love this club and I'm very lucky to be a part of it.

Gary rowed with and has been mentored by some of the Torquay SLSC's biggest legends including John 'Moose' Russell, John Heathcote and Ray Heathcote, brothers of the club's current Open men's sweep Neil 'Hec' Heathcote.

"Gary doesn't just row boats," Torquay SLSC president Tiffany Quinlan said.

"He has contributed more than just about any of our other members to be brutally honest. He's mentored me, he is an amazing human being, he has contributed his life and soul to this club and the christening is richly deserved."

Another club figure to learn under Mr Pettigrove was Mr Sweeney.

"I earned my Bronze medallion under Gary, so everything I've done over the last 30 years or so has been as a result of Gary," Mr Sweeney said.

"I thank Gary for what he has contributed to the club and my family. My daughter is rowing now, she wouldn't be doing that if it wasn't for Gary and, as the Wishart Medal says, it goes to the champion lifesaver, and he is a champion."

The new Torquay Hotel boat will be cruising the waves at the Vic State Champs in Warrnambool this weekend before hitting the Aussie Championships in Queensland.

TSLSC is very proud to announce that 55 year member Peter Milburn has been inducted into the Surf Life Saving Australia Hall of Fame.


#### From SLSA

The contribution you have made to surf lifesaving has been outstanding and your achievements and dedication remain highly valued by the organisation. The honour of being inducted into the SLSA Hall of Fame is justly deserved.'

In 1963 Peter's late father Harry asked me if I could look after him in my patrol, he was a 13 year old cadet member. Our patrol team went on to win 3 club patrol competitions!

Since the first Aussie Titles in 1915 only a handful of people Australia wide have won this very prestigious award. Peter started his career in our organisation as a young teenage cadet member and a member of the patrol that won 3 patrol competitions in a row. This record still stands in 2022. In competition he won his 1st medal as a Junior Iron Man at the Aussie Titles at Ocean Grove in 1970. After all the medals he won in the craft area, he also finished with a Bronze Medal in the Senior Boat at the Aussie Titles in Point Leo in 1985. In Victoria, Peter won the John Wishart Memorial Medal, being the most outstanding Surf Life Saver in Victoria, 1975. At state level he won 11 Gold as a Torquay member. Peter won 9 Gold, 6 Silver and 6 Bronze Medals at Australian Championship level.

We are all very proud of Peter's commitment to lifesaving.



## Milburn joins SLSA Hall of Fame

A FIRST for Torquay and a first for Victoria, one of Torquay SLSC's own, Peter Milburn, has been selected by the directors of Surf Life Saving Australia in Sydney, for the Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) Hall of Fame.

"It is a great honour, and I am very humbled to be given the selection in the Hall of Fame," Milbum said. "Torquay SLSC has taught me some great life lessons and it's been an integral part of moulding who I am today and this selection."

Milburn started as a cadet member at 13 years of age in Torquay, his hometown club, where as a patrol captain, Tony Fraser's team went on to win three club patrol competitions. A record that still stands today in 2022.

In Surf Life Saving competition at the National Championships Milburn won 11 gold medals, six silver and six bronze competing against 300 clubs nationally. His first medal, competing as a junior, was a bronze medal bought home from the Aussie Championship's Junior Iron Man race at Ocean Grove in 1970.

Milburn specialised in the craft arena for the next 15 years, where he travelled state-to-state and then of course to national competition.

The accolade column is extensive with Milburn responsible for bringing 66 individual gold medals at Australian Championship level and 11 Victorian State Titles to Torquay.

Milburn no longer lives in Torquay due to work obligations travelling across the country in several roles at Surf Live Saving Australia located in South Australia and New South Wales.

However, the current Torquay member still manages to get down to his original place of residence at least two times a year to visit the

club, but also to revisit his lifelong friends.

"It's a wonderful place, I love getting down to it and there are a number of memories there that I cherish," Milburn added. "Among my favourite memories at Torquay SLSC, I would have to say surfing in my early days ranks up there, remembering some of the big waves there, as well as some of the characters you'd meet."

as well as some of the characteristics of the Surf Life Saving Australia Hall of Fame commemorates and recognises members and teams who have achieved outstanding accomplishments and exceptional contributions to the development of surf lifesaving.


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All things considered, I don't believe I was born a 'water baby'. However, my time in lifesaving has definitely turned me into one! When I moved to Ocean Grove from the Hills Districts in Sydney, I was 11 years old and though a confident swimmer, very inexperienced in open water. I started at Ocean Grove as a Nipper and trained all the way up into Youth Squad, where I found I really loved team events like March Past, Belt and Reel and Agua Cameron relays. When I was 16, I was going to take a season off, but was asked to try surfboats instead. And in that moment during my first wave session when my oar threw me headfirst into the water, I knew it was love at first sight. And after deciding to don the blue and gold cap and join Torquay's community my love has only grown.

Surfboats is the perfect sport for those who love the water, adrenaline and other people. I've had a different boat crew every season for the past five seasons, which has allowed me to meet the most incredible people. Being in a crew together is such a special thing to share. So much laughter, air time and sometimes pain is something that I wouldn't trade for anything. Some of my fondest memories are representing the Torquay SLSC in some incredible surf nationwide and then being able to return to my supportive community with a huge smile on my face. This is really all thanks to the incredible work of my sweep/coach Jacko, the committee, and the dedicated members of Torquay SLSC.

This season I am so lucky to be the Patrol Captain of Patrol Team Boats 1. I have attained my S1 accreditation towards sweeping surfboats and was able to help out with the Adult Bronze camp in February. The candidates were absolutely incredible and I'm so excited for you to meet them all.

I look forward to seeing you all on the beach (I always bring something sweet to patrols so definitely come say hi)!









Well team, the season is fast drawing to a close, with water temperature heading South, Sun going North and us sure to be left with an Autumn Beach in the middle.

This last month or so of patrols is traditionally the toughest in terms of patrolling numbers and attendance on patrols. Could I implore all patrolling members to make that extra effort as we head to April, the last month of patrols with the finish line on Monday the 25th April, fittingly Anzac Day. We are encouraging every patrolling member for the month of April to learn something new. Ask questions on patrol get someone to show you something new. It might be a first aid technique, a lesson in the duck or timing a mock rescue. All of these are vital skills that only practice can make perfect.

Every time I think of patrols, I am filled with gratitude for every member who has worked this season either on patrols directly or in other parts of the club supporting that end game of keeping our beaches safe. Again, my gratitude also to the Patrol Captains for all the chasing, organising and running of their respective patrols.

Stay healthy and safe, if you do catch Covid or a cold don't forget to give your Captain as much warning as possible if you can't patrol.


