




COME & TRY IT AT THE CLUB!



Before the IRB (Inshore Rescue Boat) came into existence in the late 1970's, Surf Life Saving Australia were experimenting with various powered craft to replace the manually operated 5-person Surf Boat. This craft had been used for 60+ years for mass rescues throughout Australia.

At the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships at Glenelg SA in 1974 we were lucky enough to win a jet boat in a raffle draw. The engine was an Austrian Rotax 44 HP 2 stroke and was donated by Goldring Engineering.

We received the boat the following season and I was lucky enough to drive it. With big surf at the Jan Juc carnival in 1975 the Jet Boat came in handy with Chris Ralph from Jan Juc assisting on board moving the various buoys at the tide change. The acceleration on this boat was amazing however the unreliability proved its downfall. If the 2 stroke Motor stalled, you would have to wait until the engine cooled to restart.

The high tides, lack of beach and exposed rocks all making the job of looking after our beach that bit more difficult. I joined the club in 1977 because wanted a rack at the club to store my wave-rider. Max Denham who was the IRB Manager at the time and a neighbour in the camping ground, said 'join up and will get you a rack'. So I did! Max then became Presdent and conned me into taking over as IRB Manager which I did for a few years.

I obtained my bronze and started patrolling in 1978. I obtained my IRB driver/crew, ARC, Radio and then become Patrol Captain. I became an Instructor in 1980 then in 1985, an Examiner. For the next 30 years I trained and assessed many awards at the club, finally giving away about 8 years ago as it became too hard for an old guy.

I was Club Captain for years, Director of Lifesaving for 6 plus years, and I held several other committee positions.

I ran the first "live-in" Bronze camp and continued that for 6 years becoming cook and bottle washer

with Peter "Doyley" Doyle. That was a great time at the club. It was hard work but good. I remember one guy failed 3 years in a row just so he could come back for the legendary curried sausages.



Competition was R&R and the odd swim race and March Past. I competed in Masters for silver in the double ski and surf boat. I was also awarded Citation of Merit International Life Saving Federation 2005, Life Membership at Torquay 2008 and Life Membership at Life Saving Victoria 2009.

Outside the surf club, I played footy with Strathmore EDFL, umpired in the EDFL and my claim to fame was swimming in an aged final against the club legend "Tony Strahan" in the 1950's.

Life Saving is a great movement. I have made many friends and I enjoy the early morning swims with my old clubby mates but I must warn young & old members who use the change-rooms DON'T GO NEAR THE HOOKS NEAR THE ENTRY TO THE SHOWERS BECAUSE THEY ARE ALL MINE. :-)

I love seeing all the young members using the club and all the young families that are now running the club and enjoying the friendships they make.


A special shout out to all the new parents that took the plunge and completed their Age Manager training or the adult SRC. We look forward to seeing you all on the bronze bridging course next year.
