The year began with a smaller than expected committee including the unexpected resignations of the Treasurer and Marketing Directors after the AGM. Realizing there was only one way that the club and the committee could go forward, the remaining Directors reached into the greater membership database to make sure all positions were filled by capable and passionate Torquay SLSC members. Between August and November we appointed a new Treasurer, Marketing Director, Lifesaving Director, Membership Services Director and a very capable Assistant Treasurer. We now find ourselves with a full committee apart from the Functions Director role that we hope to fill for season 2023/24.

Another highlight this year that will go down in the club's folklore is the Torquay SLSC nippers team winning the Victorian Championships in Warrnambool. This achievement proves, as Matt Carmichael says, 'Team work makes the dream work'. The team work shown by Matt and the entire Nipper Section from the committee down to every nipper shows the Torquay SLSC is capable of great things.

With the inherited condition of our club building and facilities, including no definite date set for the Project Haystacks rebuild, the committee has also tasked itself with bringing the current facilities up to date. The list of items that need addressing is long, however many hazards around the club have been rectified. We are slowly working our way towards reinstating the Torquay SLSC as a warm, friendly, inviting, inclusive and safe place to be for all members and visitors.

There have been many highlights this year on the business front including the new approach to fundraising. As Jay would say we have put the 'FUN' back into fundraising and gone where no other Surf Life Saving Club has gone before. A single fundraising activity earned the club \$12K in thirty minutes at 'A Day on the Green'. Jay's approach to fundraising has been refreshing and exciting to see and I look forward to what lies ahead in the 2023/24 season.

With the culture push that is now into its second year we have united all sections of the Torquay SLSC.

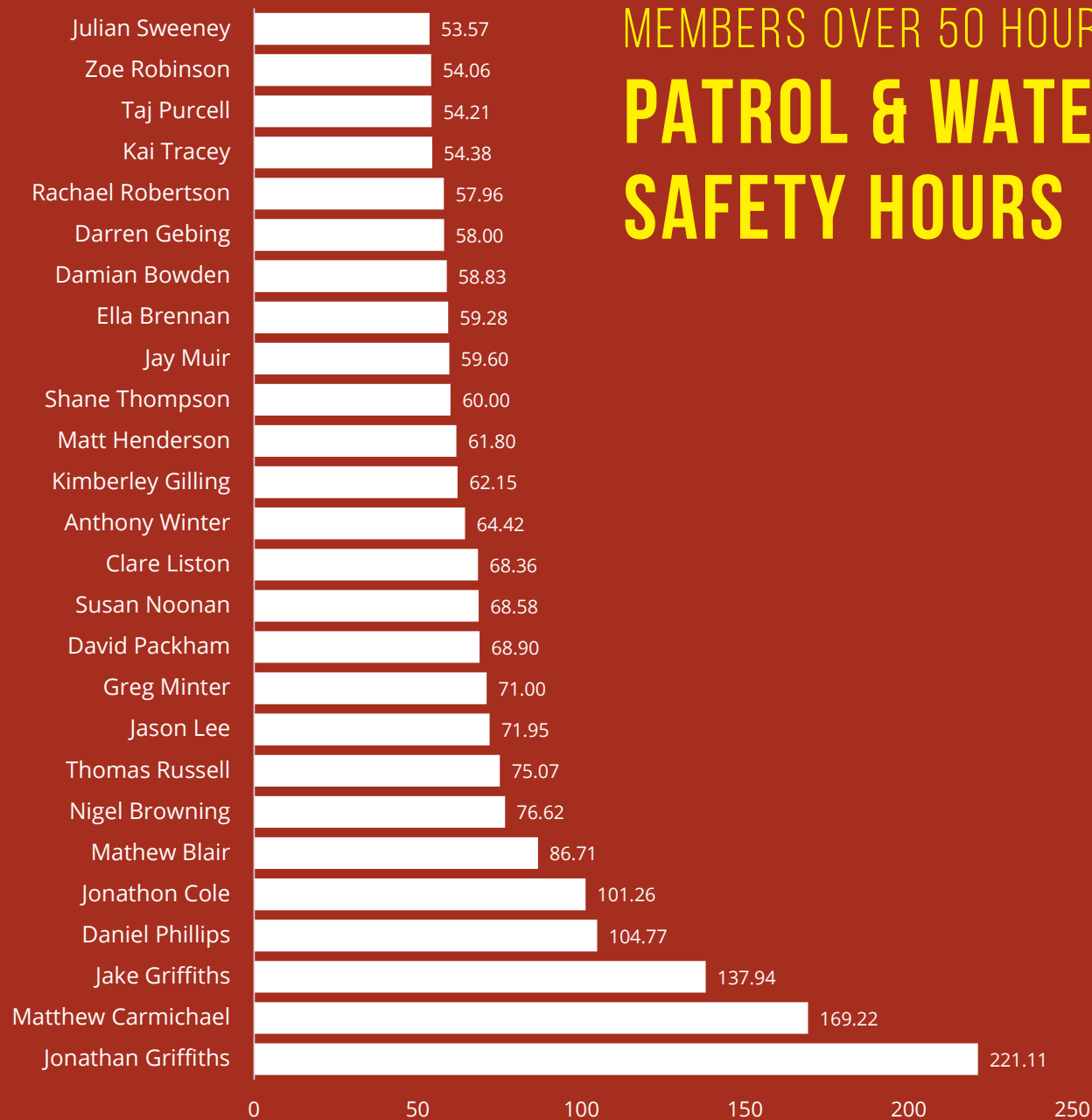
Once again Torquay Surf Life Saving Club has performed an outstanding job keeping one of the State's busiest beaches safe for another summer season. The Torquay SLSC patrolled between the flags on the Torquay beach for a total of 347 hours of weekend and public holidays between 26 November 2022 and 25 April 2023. The longest season ever with extensions to both daily hours and peak period patrol hours. The ever increasing responsibilities placed upon us by Life Saving Victoria were met with enthusiasm and professionalism by our patrolling members and have allowed some truly amazing personal performances to occur.

Our TOP 10 patrolling members accumulated more than 709 hours this season.

These members went above and beyond to keep full patrols signed on over peak periods and covered many substitute patrols. A massive personal thank you goes out as rostering and ensuring compliance with our Standard Operating Procedures is a difficult task.

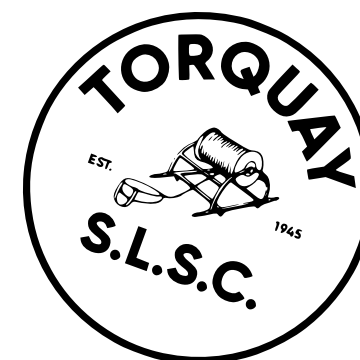

MEMBER SERVICES

MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS

Total membership numbers remained broadly steady this season, although there is a considerable turnover from year-to-year.

It is pleasing that numbers in our Active member categories have risen across the board, up around 16% since 2019. However a longer term trend (10 years) shows this is mostly driven by Cadet & Junior Active, while the numbers of Senior Active members has fallen. This is somewhat concerning when our primary obligation as a club is to provide lifesaving services and as we lose senior Active members, so too do we lose experience in an area where experience is vital.

Turnover is apparent particularly around nippers and their families. While we strive to deliver an amazing program at incredibly good value for money, there are always valid reasons why people can't or don't return. However, each year we seem to have little trouble making up those losses with new members joining.

It seems a shame to lose large numbers each year and, like many sporting and community organizations, our challenge seems to be retention rather than the initial recruitment of members.

If you are considering not rejoining next season, we would value your feedback as to why this might be the case and what the club might consider doing to boost member retention. I would welcome any constructive feedback to membership.tslsc@gmail.com

2023-24 MEMBERSHIP FEES

With club operational costs rising, the fee levels for the past few seasons have become unsustainably low. The Board took the difficult decision to increase fees slightly for the 2023/24 season, including a surcharge for every nipper & Active category member to be provided with a current SLSC compliant high visibility vest (expanded on the next page).

This decision was not taken lightly, but we believe that the value our members receive still far exceeds the cost of our club's fees and represents incredibly good value when compared to other sports and organizations.

A reminder that fees were due and payable on the 1st May 2023 – if you haven't paid, please do, so that the club has the funds to get through the winter and make all preparations for another great season in 2023/24.

HIGH VIS VESTS

One of the important safety policies adopted is the Wearing of High Visibility Vests Policy.

Having considered the risks and liabilities associated with what we do, going forward the club is adopting a zero exceptions approach to the wearing of high-vis vests for all club sanctioned water activities.

To comply with SLSA, LSV & TSLSC Policies, every member who enters the water during a club sanctioned activity (skills maintenance, training, competition, water safety, etc) is required to wear a high visibility vest. A current compliant vest will be supplied to all Active and Junior members before the commencement of next season.

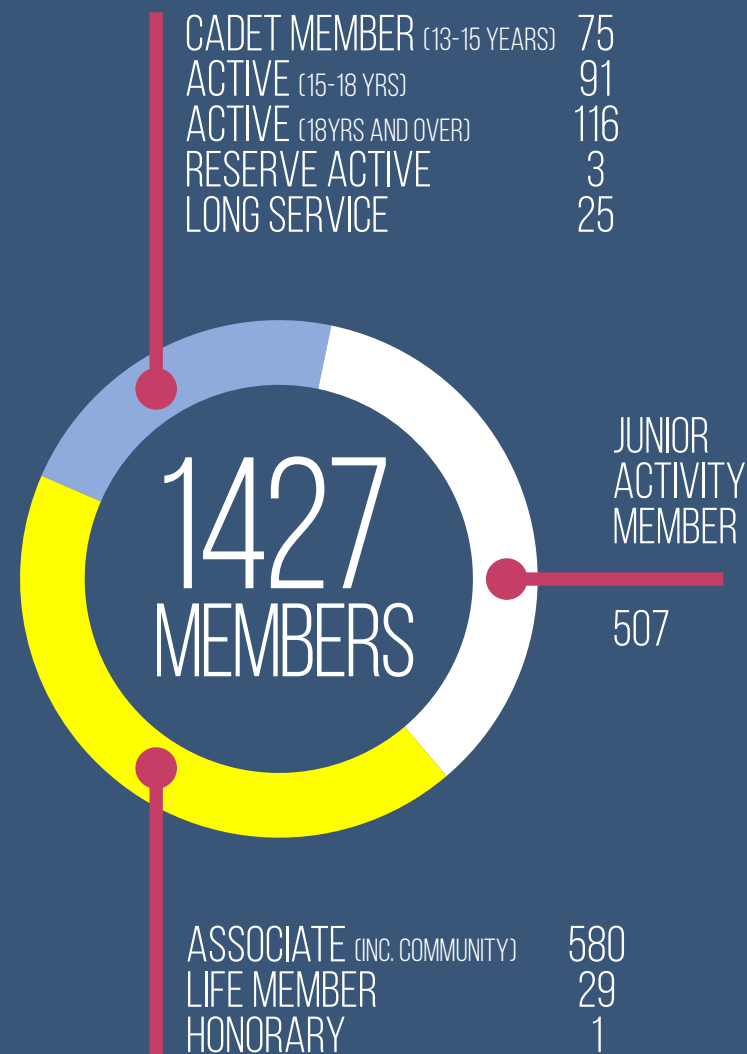
While it is accepted that there would be people with legacy high-vis vests, directly providing a new vest to every Active and Junior member was the only way to have absolute certainty that the club has fulfilled its duty to ensure that every member has a suitable and compliant vest available to them.

CLUB GOVERNANCE DOCUMENTS

The Board has been working through a process of reviewing all the club's governance documents - Constitution, By-Laws & Policies - to ensure they are appropriate for today's operational and legal environment. This has been an exhausting and ongoing process of reviewing hundreds of pages of existing documents and potential amendments.

The first step has been completed, with all the club's Policies now compiled and ratified and By-Laws reviewed and updated. They have been published to the club website and are available for all members to view. As changes are made in future, this web page will be updated to reflect the current versions of all club governance documents.

What a success story the 55th Season of nippers has been for the Torquay Surf Life Saving Club (SLSC). Our superstar age managers, assistant age managers and team managers have created a fantastic atmosphere of inclusion and support in the nipper section. All 507 of our nippers have shown tremendous courage and each and every one of them inspired me throughout my second term as Director of Junior Development.

This supportive environment has seen us have an average attendance of 121 nippers at each training session and a whopping 320 nippers on average attend each of the 8 sessions of the Summer Holiday Program (SHP). Whilst our overall enrolments did fall 3% this season, along with our average attendance, I take this small decrease as a win. With everything now open following covid restrictions lifting, there were a lot more options for families to choose from for activities and travel.





Building on the vision of Scott McCardel and Matt Henderson, the past and continuing members of the nipper sub committee have been able to set a clear vision over multiple seasons of what the Torquay SLSC nipper program is all about. This inclusive and supportive outlook has developed the capabilities of all nippers, from those with extensive beach experience to those who may be attending the program for the first time.

The Lorne camp was once again a success story for the section with 118 nippers and their families attending the camp to develop their skills and form those social bonds that are such an integral part of our club. This year we once again engaged with some legends of the club, Simon Strahan, Julia Cullity and Kimmy Gilling delivering guidance to our age managers on how to develop the skills of all our nippers. This training sure paid off with the development of the whole nipper cohort coming along in leaps and bounds.

We have seen a resurgence in our nippers interest in the more traditional life saving events. We had 20 competitors in Rescue & Resuscitation (R&R) throughout the season and 16 representing us at the Victoria Junior Championship. The hard work of the R&R coaches Penny, Paula & Sarah, (along with a little help from our friends Mel and Emma from Anglesea) paid off. We had some phenomenal results which included a gold and silver at the Victorian Championships and many minor places. We had numerous teams entered into the Belt & Reel events. If anyone would like to sponsor a new Belt & Reel for the nipper section please reach out!

This season we have been fortunate to have two board rescue boards donated from the Torquay SLSC Foundation and two board rescue boards purchased by the club. These boards will be ready to go in the new 2023/24 season and with design input from Zeb Walsh and legends like Julia Cullity and Simon and David Strahan spending time around the nipper section we will be in a good place for success next season.



The supportive atmosphere created by our age managers, assistant age managers and team managers empowered a large number of our nippers to represent the club at carnivals. We averaged 103 nippers at each of the 5 Life Saving Victoria (LSV) carnivals. 93 nippers represented Torquay SLSC at the Victorian Junior Championships in Warrnambool. The philosophy to develop the capabilities of all our nippers really paid off too. Nipper Captains Olivia

Hayden and Angus Brereton led Team Torquay to take out top spot at 4 of the 5 carnivals, and after a nail biting final day, finishing on top of the podium at the Victorian Junior Championships. This is something that has only been achieved on two occasions before, and is a result we are incredibly proud of and should be celebrated by everyone involved.

One of the highlights of the season was a visit to the club by a very special guest - the AFL premiership cup! This came full circle by the end of the season with a personal message to all the nippers from Geelong Football Club Captain Joel Selwood congratulating Team Torquay on a fantastic win at the Victorian Junior Championships.



Of course such a result is never achieved without the magnificent efforts by a multitude of people. I would again like to thank all of the following people. 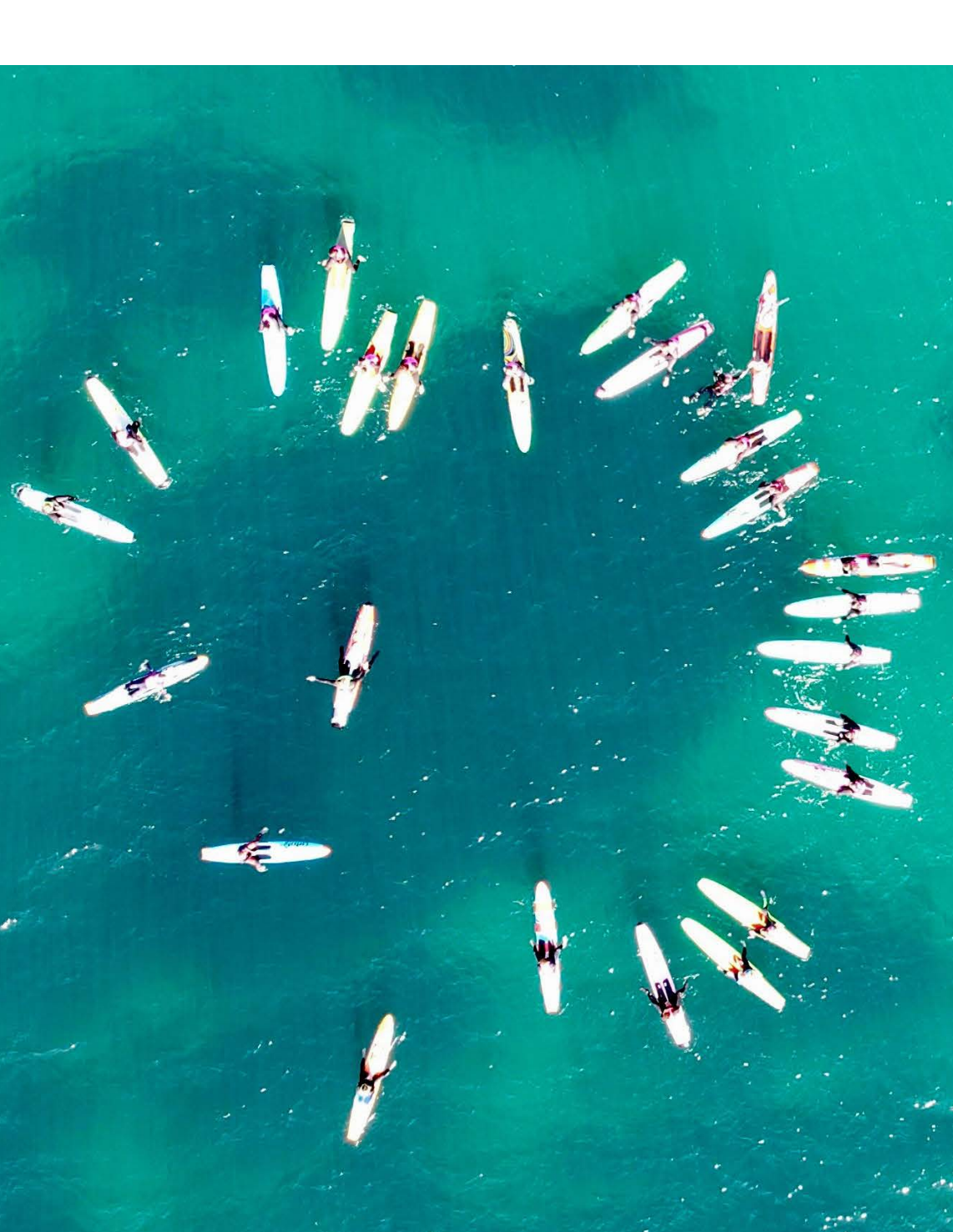

TSLSC Trust

Jack Harris Memorial

The Torquay Surf Lifesaving Club Trust (Jack Harris Memorial) was established as a result of the exercise of a discretion given to the co-executors of the Estate of the late John (Jack) Dudley Harris – a Torquay resident. Jack had developed an association with the Torquay Surf Life Saving Club through his friendship with members of the club and other Torquay locals.

Jack, in his Will directed that his executors distribute part of his estate amongst charitable organisations, the choice of which was to be at the discretion of the executors. In the exercise of that discretion the executors made a distribution to Barwon Health, cancer research, Geelong Legacy and other charitable institutions one being Torquay SLSC.

Regarding the bequeath and given its value the club decided that the capital was to be preserved and the opportunity which had presented itself maximised for the benefit of the Club and the swimming public using the Torquay beach and its environs.

The Trust was formed as a separate entity from the Club and the capital of the Trust does not form any part of the assets of the Torquay SLSC. The Trust was formally constituted by a Trust Deed and Trustees (who are required to be Torquay SLSC members) were appointed to manage the Trust.

The current Trustees are Richard Greenhough (Secretary), Lindsay Newstead (Treasurer), Peter Doyle, David Shaw (OAM), Bryan Thomas, David Steed, Ian Turner and Bill Johnson (AM).

All Trustees are volunteers receiving no payments for their time administering the Trust. The Trust is a registered charity with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) and is required to provide the ACNC with an Annual Information Statement (AIS). You can view the Trust's AIS or any other registered charities AIS at the ACNC Website: <https://www.acnc.gov.au/charity>



Most donations to the Trust have come from deceased estates. By bequeathing money to the Trust, a person can, even after death be assured that their bequest will continue to contribute to a safer community.

The capital base of the Trust is preserved in perpetuity and income from investments only are used to reimburse the club by way of a donation for 'Core Lifesaving Equipment' which the club has purchased.

The Trust presented the club with a cheque for \$5,494.50 this season. The cheque reimbursed the club for their purchase of 13 Little Anne training manikins - 'Core Lifesaving Equipment'. The Trust will also be making a further donation of \$28,218.18 in May 2023 which will cover the club's purchase of 2 new IRBs.

These donations will bring the Trust total donations since the Trust was established in 1995 to more than \$224,000.

PROJECT HAYSTACKS

Over the past 12 months, considerable work has been undertaken for Project Haystacks and we are now in the final stages of the design phase. Towards the end of last year, John Mercer and Geoff Croker invited members to come to the club and view the plans that had been prepared based on a design brief that had been approved by the Board. This allowed members the opportunity to ask questions and see firsthand the spectacular design fjmt Studio had created, that was functional as well as an iconic building that would fit well into its coastal surroundings.

A team of consultants were engaged in the development of the schematic design leveraging off their expertise in structural and geotechnical engineering, services, and landscaping. We have worked particularly close with accessibility

consultants to ensure the design increases public access and landscape architects to improve the amenity to the building and its immediate surroundings, not to mention the beach!

The pre-application process with the Surf Coast Council and GORCAPA has commenced, and we have engaged a coastal engineer as advised by the authorities to ensure the longevity of our building and its suitability to the environmental conditions on the coast. If everything continues to plan, we aim to submit to town planning as soon as the pre-application proceedings are finalised in June.

Next stage and the harder challenge is to get the funding to build this. In 2018 the Federal Coalition committed \$500,000 which has allowed us to get this far, but to complete the build and fit out we

need \$23 million. As a club, we need to start a fundraising campaign and we need to lobby both the State and Federal governments. The Torquay Surf Life Saving Club (SLSC) is focussed on nurturing an inclusive and supportive culture, with programs to engage all members. Whether it's patrolling our beach, earning a Bronze medallion, undertaking first aid training, joining the competition team, learning skills as a nipper, using the club facilities and gym or taking part in many social activities, there's a place for everyone and we want to keep it that way for generations to come.

TREASURY

2022/23 saw the relaxing of covid restrictions and that was reflected in the increased activity at the Club. This year the Club has made a surplus of \$15k.

Memberships have increased again from \$119k to \$121k. Accommodation is almost back to its pre covid level providing \$21k of income. Whilst other income producing highlights include Bar Sales \$13k in 21/22 to \$81k in 22/23 and BBQ and Kiosk from \$33k to \$54k.

With assistance from the Jack Harris Trust we were able to secure \$33k of donations for the Club for critical lifesaving equipment which makes an incredible difference and one we are most appreciative for. The donation was primarily for the reimbursement of the purchase of 2 new IRBs.

The Club continues to work with the TSLSC Foundation to secure further donations.

The increase in activity brings with it an increase in costs. Competition fees increased from \$24k in 21/22 to \$37k 22/23, Medical expenses increased from \$5k to \$10k and Bar Expenses from \$12k to \$38k.

Project Haystacks received an additional \$200k this financial year, adding to the \$300k previously received. Of the \$500k received, \$258,962.28 has been spent to 30 April 2023, with a remaining \$241,037.72 unspent.

I am stepping back from the Treasurer's role due to other commitments I have taken on. I would sincerely like to thank Julian Sweeney for his leadership and the trust he has placed in me. I also must thank Michelle Gilling and Steve Marvilla for everything they have assisted me with in the role.

I have really enjoyed working with the current committee and wish I had more hours in the day so that I could continue in this role.

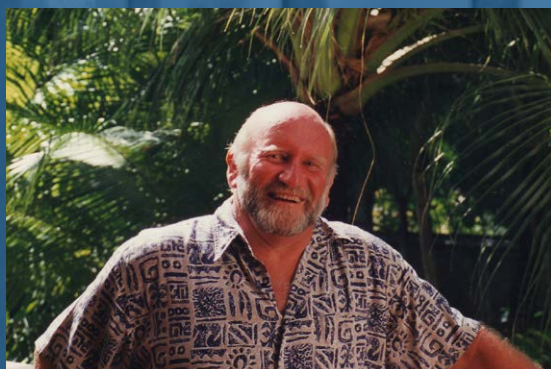

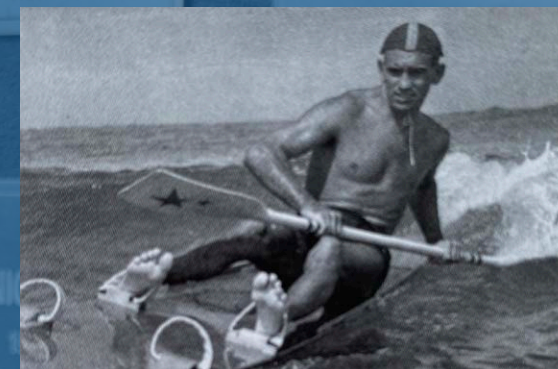

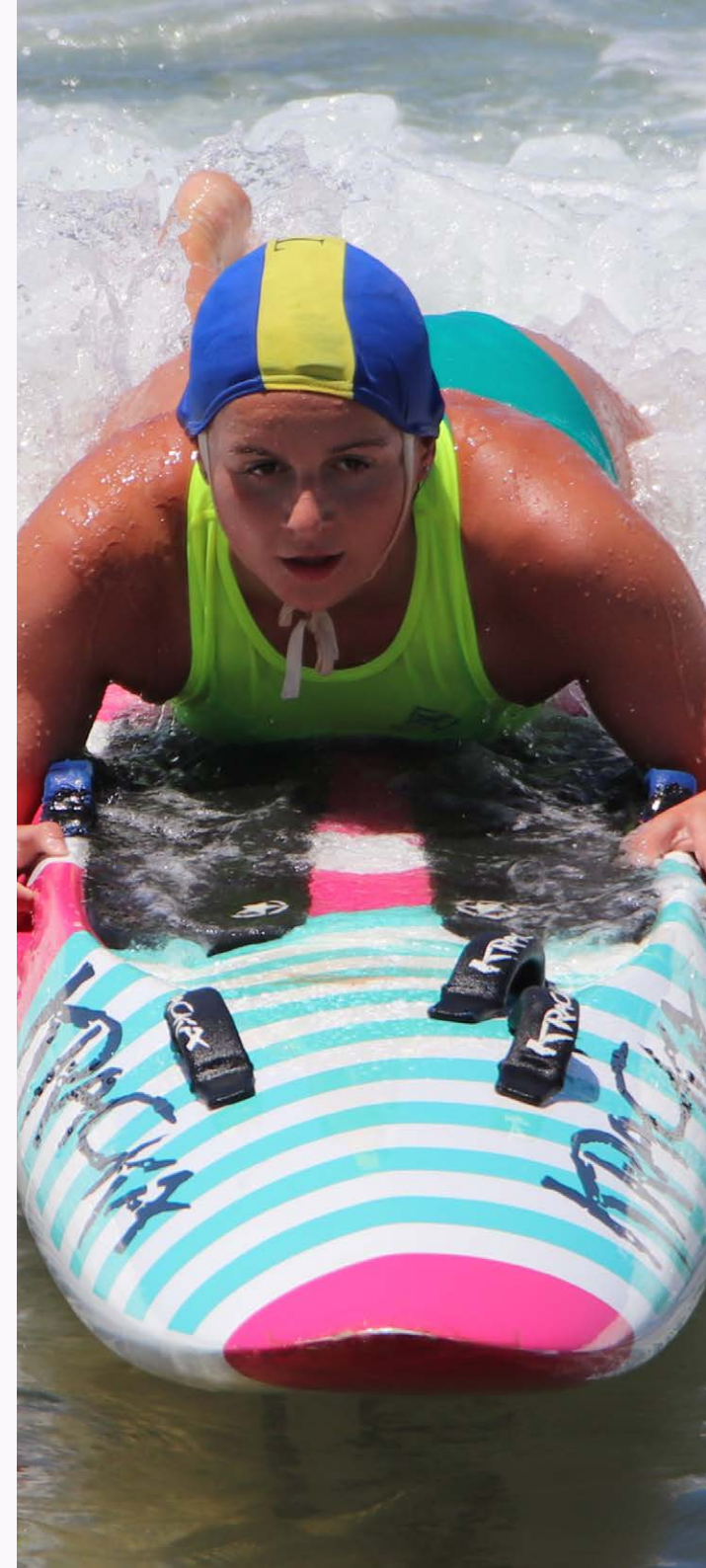
