



Where Nippers Started!

As the result of a minute, moved by H Pittard/T Fraser on 27 January 1967 — "that the recruiting sub-committee consider the possibility of introducing a Nipper membership" this section of the club got under way in December 1967. The necessary preparation was taken on by Charles Lyne who reported its progress to the Committee at intervals throughout that year. With committee approval on 18 October 1967 - "that the juvenile club be run as a sub-committee of the TSLSC" its establishment was formalised.

The nippers were to be aged 5-13 years however this changed to 7-13 years. A sub-committee comprising; Chas Lyne (Convenor), Ian Stevenson, John Fay, Russell Mole, Alan Coulson, David Brownlee, Frank Trainor, Dick Major, Stewy Skene & Club Captain John Pettigrove was instituted. Fees were set at 0.50 cents with all accounts and fund raising to be handled by them.

The aim and objective of the nipper movement was to train young boys, (initially nippers were boys only) in safe surf procedure, life saving techniques and beach competition fundamentals. It was hoped that on reaching the required age they would advance to the senior club and continue their training to become fully fledged lifesavers.

Parents were also encouraged to take up membership. It was apparent that many young girls wanted to join the nipper movement and be involved also. This was fulfilled when a member of the Ladies auxiliary Mrs Margaret Bradshaw, gained permission from the club executive to form the Nipperettes at the start of season 1973/74. They showed they were equal to the lifesaving tasks and beach events set by the instructors. Both groups eventually integrated. The 1st nipper carnival was held at Point Lonsdale SLSC on 28 December 1969. Teams from Point Lonsdale SLSC, Ocean Grove SLSC ,13th beach SLSC and Torquay SLSC participated. Reports at the time indicated it was a great success. The Nipper Movement was on its way.

- People who want to maintain their skills and fitness for patrol.



I joined the Torquay SLSC in 1980 and I have been the Head Ski Paddling Coach since 2011 before finishing up in December 2022.

My results for Torquay SLSC include 3 silver medals at the Australian Surf lifesaving Championships. I won 2 silver medals in 1984 & 1985 teaming up with Tim Munro in the Junior Double Ski & in 1987 in the Open Ski Relay with Tim Bush & Calvin Newstead we won another silver medal.

At the Victorian Championships I won 3 Open Single Ski Titles and 6 x Open Double Ski Titles and many Open Men's Ski Teams & Open Men's Taplin Titles – the last being a Victorian open double ski title with Glenn Singleton and Open Taplin Relay in 2019 at age 52. I have loved being a Torquay SLSC team member for most of these years. I have blue and gold in my veins.

In addition, I have twice been a member of the Australian Flatwater/Sprint Kayak Team & former member of the AIS, VIS & QAS flatwater kayaking programs, winning 4 Australian sprint kayaking championships

In the last 10 or so years in ocean paddling my best results include top 10 overall in the 2012 & 2014 Molokai World Surf Ski Championships, and have travelled to Hawaii for this event many times since. I am also a qualified Naturopath, breath coach/respiratory therapist, nutritionist, herbal medicine practitioner and Mickel Therapist specialising in chronic illness.
