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President's Report






As the season begins it is time to welcome our new and existing members to the Torquay Surf Life Saving Club (Torquay SLSC)

Torquay SLSC Order of Australia awardees.

Several members of the Torquay SLSC have received awards under the Order of Australia scheme which commenced in 1975. The four categories are Companion, Officer, Member and Medal. The list below indicates the known members, their awards and citations, not all having been related to their surf activities.

Members of the Order of Australia

Charlie Lyon AM For service to surf lifesaving.

Eugene "Titch" Cullity AM For service to the law and to the community, particularly through support for programs to rehabilitate juvenile offenders, and to Calvary Health Care Bethlehem.

Bill Johnson AM For significant service to medicine in the field endocrinology, as an educator and mentor, and to surf lifesaving.

Terry Wall AM For service to the coal industry as a researcher in the coal sciences, particularly in the technical areas related to coal combustion and to education.

Medals of the Order of Australia

Peter Troy AOM For service to surfing, particularly as a contributor to the establishment of the sport and as an historian, and to the surf lifesaving movement.

Peter Doak AOM For services to sport, and to the community of Geelong

Ken Pollard AOM For service to the community through the Torquay Surf Life Saving Club.

Leon Weigard AOM For service to sport, particularly the Olympic movement as an administrator, and to the community through a range of charitable organisations.

Peter Tonkin AOM For service to swimming.

David Shaw OAM Has been recognised for service to community health - in particular the Prostate Cancer Foundation - and Australian rules football.

Michael Klim OAM For service to sport as a gold medallist at the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

Anthony Strahan OAM For Service to Surf Lifesaving.

Prior to 1975 awards were made under the British Empire award system, with both (old) Dick Garrard and Ainslie (Sprint) Walker having Officer (OBE) awards.

SENTENCED TO



On Sunday 18 June 2023, at the 78th AGM of the Torquay SLSC Dennis Carty and David Shaw were inducted as Life Members of the Torquay Surf Life Saving Club. Hooray! A précis of their history.



DENNIS CARTY DAVID SHAW

Dennis Carty joined the Torquay SLSC on 2 January 1968. He passed the bronze examination on 17 March 1973. The Associate section was formed for fundraising purposes and managed by a separate committee for 3 decades. Dennis has held many committee positions including Club Vice President for 3 years, President of the Associates for 4 years, Member of Associates Committee for 24 years.

He has also been a member of many sub committees which include Liquor Licence, Jet Power Boat, Carnival, Night Surf carnival, 50th Year Anniversary and the Finance and Honda day at the beach which was held for 3 years and was a huge financial success. Dennis organised a Honda SUV on loan for competitors to be transported to surf carnivals. He also organised through Suzuki Australia the supply of 4 vehicles free of charge to raffle. The money raised was the largest amount by one person in the history of our club. Dennis was involved with other club members in a night rescue at Rocky Point on 23 January 1988. The club received a letter of Commendation from SLSA.

Dennis received his 50 year membership in 2018.

David Shaw OAM. David joined the Torquay SLSC in 1959 and passed the bronze examination on 30 January 1960. He was a member of the Patrol Team that won 3 club inter patrol competitions in a row. He competed at surf carnivals in double ski events and was also part of the gold medal team that won the open beach relay at the Victorian Senior Championships in 1963.

He played in 2 premierships with the Essendon Football Club. David was given time off from training with the Essendon Football Club at Windy Hill during the summer to concentrate on Surf Life Saving events.

David has been our Club's Honorary Solicitor since 1986. For 37 years he has provided advice to the club. Since establishment in 1995 he has been a Trustee of the TSLSC Trust (Jack Harris Memorial).

David was a great contributor for 64 years.



Member Profile: Tony Strahan



Tony was born and raised in the Melbourne beachside suburb of Sandringham and in 1953 at age 11, his family moved to Geelong where he attended school at Geelong College.

He and his brother and two sisters were soon taught to swim at Eastern Beach baths in Corio Bay, the only pool in Geelong at that time. The family subsequently joined the Geelong Western Swimming Club based at Eastern Beach and began successful swimming careers.

Tony, Hugh, and Elizabeth later became Victorian swimming champions in the early 1960's, and Tony soon became a three-time Australian swimming team representative, including at the 1962 Commonwealth Games in Perth where he won a gold medal in the 4x220 yards freestyle relay along with the legendary Murray Rose, in a new world record.

The following year he was in the Australian team which toured Japan, Russia, East and West Germany, Sweden, Denmark, Norway, and England. During the competition in East Germany, he witnessed the dramatic exploits of many East Germans attempting to escape from strict communist oppression into West Germany. He still has these vivid memories nearly 60 years later.

His brother Hugh, apart from being a successful swimmer and surf lifesaver, later concentrated on football and proceeded to play 88 games with the Geelong Cats between 1968 and 1972.

Tony later began a successful period in Master's swimming competition winning over 50 Victorian and Australian titles and a World 50 meters freestyle title at the World Masters swimming championships in 1988. In 1994 he won two titles at the World Masters Games in the 50 meters and 100 meters freestyle.

He has also won the Lorne Pier to Pub swim event 15 times over various age groups.

Tony Strahan Far Right Member of Common-wealth World Record Breaking Team 1962

Tony joined the Torquay Surf Life Saving Club in 1960 and has been a member for 60 years as a surf lifesaver, competitor, Treasurer, Competition Director, and chairman of the Audit and Risk Committee. In addition, he is a former Treasurer and Finance Committee member of Swimming Victoria, and Life Saving Victoria (LSV) Competition Panel Chairman, Victoria Nipper team coach and LSV Superintendent of Nipper activities throughout Victoria.

He has been a member of multiple Victorian surf lifesaving teams, including Captain of the teams to New Zealand in 1980 and California, USA in 1987. He has won 14 Australian Master's individual gold medals. In 2007 he won a gold medal in the individual Rescue Tube race at the World Master's surf lifesaving titles at Lorne.

Professionally, Tony qualified as a Chartered Accountant and practised mainly in auditing, taxation and succession planning.

Various Awards achieved include the Order of Australia Medal (OAM) for service to surf lifesaving, Australian Sports Medal for Australian Sporting Achievement, Citation of Merit from World Lifesaving, Life memberships of Torquay Surf Lifesaving Club, Life Saving Victoria and Geelong Swimming Club. Tony's sons, David and Simon have been proud members of the Club since joining the nippers in 1980/81 and have also represented Victoria in numerous interstate and overseas teams. They have each won over 50 individual Victorian surf lifesaving championships gold medals and are a former Club Captain and Club President, respectively.

Facilities Report Jono Griffiths



Well, it is a new year for the club, and it is off to a busy start! I am excited to do my part in helping the club out in my role as Director of Facilities.

The month began with needed improvements to the security of the facility. We have added an additional motor to the craft shed enabling easy access for both boards and skis. We are on track for meeting our Health Safety & Environment obligations by developing an asbestos register and electrical test and tagging. Unfortunately, however this month also saw the need to complete some unplanned maintenance with the failure of our walk in cool room. With a guick turnaround, we have secured a replacement condenser and managed to have this critical equipment replaced with no impact on operations and events. Thanks to our partners and Bellarine Refrigeration.

The implementation of a 'jobs list' is underway. We are looking towards the development of a way to engage with those who have some time and are willing to assist with the upkeep on the building. The concept will follow a 'See It, Call It, Fix It' approach by enabling a way for members to identify potential maintenance needs, add it to a list and then pull from that list a task they may be willing to help with. Should any of our members have the ability to help out and are willing in any way, please do not hesitate to reach out as all help is appreciated and needed.

Lastly, the annual health inspection has been completed. For the age of the facilities, it was pleasing to receive a pass with minimal improvements required. A massive call out to Tod who works tirelessly to maintain the cleanliness and hygiene of the building.





Senior Competition Tim Altman



I'm excited to take on the role of Competition Director.

I have competed and worked professionally in surf lifesaving, flatwater kayaking and ocean paddling for over 40 years. I have seen and learned much, and I still maintain contact with colleagues in similar positions in clubs around the country.

I have spoken with several peers who I respect very much about the best approach moving forward for our club. With the right support, I believe it will yield some fantastic results both as a positive, healthy environment for young people to be involved in (and parents), as well as achieving great results in competition.

Our numbers at senior level are not great, so we will undergo a rebuild, but that offers an exciting challenge.



THE COACH'S BLACKBOARD

THE NEXT 2 YEARS

- 1. Rebuild athlete numbers and culture within the Competition section —a culture that is fun, inclusive and respectful for all.
- 2. Ideally have 2 relay teams per discipline, per age group, per gender including board, ski, swim, beach and boats. Even IRB & R&R if possible. Building athlete numbers and culture is the priority. No one is any more important than anyone else in the team, regardless of ability/standard, gender, age etc. Place the right management and coaching structure behind a group with numbers, and the right culture, and the results at all levels will look after themselves.
 - 3. Set up a coaching panel utilising the wealth of IP and expertise that has come through the club over 50 years. We are in unique position in Victorian lifesaving that we don't need to outsource expertise or coaching it is abundant within the history of the club if we can encourage them to be involved, or to come back.
 - 4. Build a masters team that also encourages many of these former competitors back to the club. Provide a pathway for new masters competitors wishing to get involved ie. parents etc. Surf lifesaving is a lifestyle sport that is available to athletes of all ages.
 - 5. Bridge the gap between nippers and the open & age competitors (U15, 17 and above). Have senior, master & U19 competitors come down regularly to nippers to assist. Also help coach/train the parents who are supervising and training the nippers. Perhaps also some club events incorporating nippers and above.
 - 6. Run regular trips, training days/weekends etc. increase the fun and adventure of training.

There have been questions around the commencement of training for the 2023/24 season. We simply had to wait until after the Annual General Meeting in late June before information could be circulated. The training outline and carnival dates have now been released.

The commencement of training in August is later than our neighbouring clubs for formal club training to commence, however the head coach Nick Thomas, the coaching panel (to be introduced to you soon) and I all concur that given the Victorian Championships are in late March, and Aussies in midlate April there is no need for panic.

In many cases, I've seen clubs begin training too early and the competitors end up being burn out by Christmas.

Most of the senior competitors have been doing their own pre-season training, either swimming, running, gym, football/netball/hockey etc. for some time.

We've commenced developmental ski sessions already, and these will be held every Sunday at 9am at Torquay SLSC - sessions will be either on Spring Creek, at Fishos or at Torquay beach. Any competitors wanting to learn to paddle and start building efficient technique and surf skills are welcome.

In addition, we will return to the Sunday morning club sessions that many of us grew up with. These will be held at 9am on the first Sunday of the month at Torquay SLSC for all competitors wanting to attend - including senior competitors, youth, masters etc. across all sections.

The nature of the session will depend on conditions but may vary from a run and paddle (craft of choice), a longer steady paddle, or if it's pumping, we'll go for a tea surf (again, craft of choice - including surfboards).

This session is designed not only for development of fitness, technique, and skills, it is principally designed to get the whole team together with breakfast afterwards at the club.

This is a tradition that the club held for several decades, one that many of us believe to be important for the club culture.

Finally, some are doing the occasional high performance or winter development programs through LSV.

Whilst these can be valuable, the Competition section and coaching panel strongly believe that we have more than enough coaching experience and expertise within the club to tap into, with many competitors having represented their country at national and international level, won national medals and championships, as well as spending time living and training in Qld.

Whilst we are happy for you to attend the state sessions, and support you in doing so, we don't believe those who don't will be handicapped at all.

Building a strong club training environment and culture is far more potent than occasional.

Nipper News Matt Carmichael





The age caps have been washed, detangled and counted with extra stock ordered - this can mean only one thing - only 6 weeks until nippers season starts! We have received strong responses from most of our volunteer helpers from last season, but the emphasis this season will be helping more of our family groups achieve some awards so that we can continue to deliver the best nipper program on the surf coast!

As our program continues to expand, we will require additional volunteers to ensure we deliver a program that continues to provide a pathway for future lifesavers through life saving skill development and surf sports. We also want to bring families and friends together in community service, foster an appreciation and respect for the ocean and natural environment whilst adhering to the principles outlined in the Member Charter.



We are creating a great atmosphere in the nipper section which is resulting in some very dedicated young members wanting to spend a lot of time around the club. This is demonstrated by 14 nippers (or recently graduated nippers) gaining a place on the Life Saving Victoria (LSV) Winter Development Squad. This equates to 20% of the total squad - we might need to look at running our own internal program next winter to give some of the other clubs a chance!

As you are all aware the nipper section has grown significantly in recent years, so the key measure of success for us is retention rates, because if nippers are returning, we are doing the right thing!

Retention rates and volunteer engagement are two areas of focus this year and will be critical to our success and provide an opportunity for all to assist in any small way they can and exhibit the culture and character of Torquay SLSC.

On the beach, we plan on leveraging the depth of lifesaving skills and experience within the club to develop a coaching program for our Nippers. Off the beach, we need to harness the diverse skills of our nipper families to share the load of running such a large program in the short term, and build the capability within the section to continue delivering high quality nippers programs for the next 5-10 years and beyond.

Once again If you are keen to get involved next season, please don't hesitate to contact a committee member. Keep your eye out on social media for any upcoming courses or expressions of interest, or in the meantime log onto the SLSA portal and have a go at completing your age managers or technical officials accreditation prior to season start. Currently we are seeking additional Age Managers for every age group and for members to complete their technical official training online so please let us know if you are happy to help out.

I look forward to seeing you on the beach or in the water.
