The calendar of events is quickly filling up this year and we look forward to one weekend in particular, The Jim Wall Ironman Event weekend. On Friday 5 January we will once again be hosting the Cosy Corner Carnival followed by the Nipper Disco on Saturday 6 January. The Nipper Disco was HUGE last year with numbers we haven't seen for a long time in the backyard. Hopefully this year will be the same.



On Sunday 7 January 2024 the Torquay SLSC and the Summer of Surf will once again roll out the Jim Wall Ironman event.

About the Jim Wall Ironman event.

THE JIM WALL IRONMAN EVENT HAS BEEN AN ICONIC Part of the surf coast lifesaving culture since the 60s, in fact, it's the longest running iron event in the world!

The Wall family's massive contribution to the Torquay SLSC started in December 1945 at Jim Wall's campsite behind the surf beach sand dunes. This is when the forming a surf club was proposed – and within weeks the Torquay SLSC was founded on Jim Wall and Frank Murphy's motion. Jim's brother Tom became Honorary Secretary in 1947 serving 7 years in all and Jim was elected president in 1949 and continued for 13 years. Under Jim's leadership the Club took on many firsts, but of great significance was the staging of the Australian & International Surf Life Saving Championships in 1956, in conjunction with the Melbourne Olympic Games, viewed on the surf beach by about 70,000 spectators.



Starting as the Jim Wall "Surfathon" in 1962 and named for early club resident Jim Wall, the unique event was first created at Torquay SLSC to challenge all round surf and water ability, with an endurance format including continuous efforts in swimming, board, ski paddling and beach running. It is believed to be the first continuous ironman event ever staged in that format that has now become standard. The event has become a coveted 'hit out' for both local and interstate athletes, with the sought-after prize being a hand on the Jim Wall trophy.

Having been won by many well-known athletes over recent years such as Matt Bevilacqua, Harriet Brown, Naomi Scott and Georgia Miller. The event has seen its fair share of local champions too – names such as David Strahan, Zeb Walsh, Cliff Goulding and Terry Wall (son of Jim) in the early days have also graced the podium.

In modern times the event has become part of a national circuit and as females have greatly bolstered the surf lifesaving movement, they are now competing in their section of the event as fiercely as their male counterparts.



The summer of surf lifesaving is quickly approaching, and we look forward to seeing all our members down at the beach on patrol, competing at carnivals, participating in nipper training and most of all enjoying each other's company.



Simon has been a member of the Torquay SLSC for over 40 years, having started as a nipper at age 6 and quickly thereafter following dad Tony and brother David into competing for the blue and gold.

Simon was a member of several Victorian Nipper Teams and then progressed into making Victorian teams as a junior and senior competitor after success in the surf race, belt race, board rescue and Taplin races at the State Titles. Simon was also selected in Victorian Teams to tour the United States and New Zealand and was chosen as a surf swimmer in a Nutri-Grain series. Simon's gold medal at the Australian Swimming Championships (pool) in the 4x100 medley relay, his win in the Lorne Pier to Pub and his 3rd in the Open Belt Race at the Australian Surf Championships stand out as his best competitive achievements.

As a mature athlete Simon also won a World Masters Swimming Championship gold in the 100 butterfly and partnered with Brendan Garreau for a gold in the board rescue at the Australian Masters Surf Titles.

In addition to patrolling for over 30 years, Simon has served as the Torquay SLSC President, Marketing Director, Swimming Captain and Beach Captain, as well as serving as Chairman and Trustee on the Jack Harris Memorial (TSLSC) Trust.

Early in his surf lifesaving journey Simon was also selected by Surf Life Saving Australia for its Emerging Leaders Program.




Julian Sweeney Nipper to President!

Strategic Goal Setting

As a club, particularly one with such rich sporting history, we should be acutely aware how critical goal setting and planning are to achieving success.

To know if we have been successful, we need to know what we were aiming to achieve in the first place. As this Surf Sun &Sand goes to press, the Board are working on our strategic goal setting for season 2023/24. The Directors have been presented with the seemingly simple questions:

WHAT DOES SUCCESS LOOK LIKE? IF WE WERE TO LOOK BACK ON THIS SEASON IN JUNE 2024, HOW WOULD WE DEFINE WHETHER IT HAS BEEN SUCCESSFUL OR NOT?

Planning for more than just being reactive on a day-to-day basis, the Board is attempting to set out some clear goals for the season, which we can then track, measure and report back to the members. These will appear in the next Surf Sun & Sand and we hope they will provide a positive focus and direction for our members to support and achieve together.

Governance Review Update

The Board has been continuing the process of reviewing the club's governance documents, taking on and advancing a series of recommendations made to the Board last year. For a club the size and complexity of ours, this is quite a major undertaking and certainly not a "tick and flick" exercise. Nor is it 'set and forget' but has to be living and evolving alongside the evolution of the club itself.

So far, we have reviewed and adopted a series of Policies to cover a range of subjects. Many of these reinforce LSV policies and simply document standard club practices that we are all fairly familiar with. However, it is important that the club has a clear record of these guidelines for members to refer to as and when needed.

We have also began updating the club By-Laws, to ensure the Policies do not conflict and that our operational rules comply with and enhance the base requirements set out in the club's Constitution. Some key updates so far include clarifying expectations for the Board to establish committees and sub-committees to drive the administration and operational level of the club's activities, adopting a clear process for recognition of member milestones and achievements, and an update of the Members Charter.

The current club governance documents are available to all members on the club website.





Torquay Surf Life Saving Club Members Charter

This charter establishes a standard by which we conduct ourselves towards others and carry out our duties and obligations as members of the Torquay Surf Life Saving Club

We will at all times:

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- Promote & prioritise safety in enjoying our ocean environment, through our actions and the example we set to fellow club members and the public
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others Be fair, considerate, and honest in all dealings with •
- Accept responsibility for our actions

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- Be a positive role model •
- Refrain from any form of bullying or harassment •

Contribute to a harmonious, safe, and enjoyable club. Be aware of and maintain an uncompromising adherence to SLSA's standards, rules, regulations and policies

Policies

As we approach the start of the season, we particularly highlight policies on Patrol Member Obligations, Positional Appointments (ie: how we appoint people to positions of responsibility for underage members), Team Selection (applicable for both Junior & Senior competition) and Private Equipment Storage & Transport.

Also, a reminder that the Wearing of High Visibility Vests Policy applies to all Torquay SLSC members, and visiting members, during club-endorsed water activities. If you're unsure why SLSA, LSV and Torquay SLSC view this as so important, please have a conversation with Grant, or anyone who was at one of the Aussie Titles in 1996, 2010 or 2012 where competitors were tragically lost, to appreciate the background to some of our key safety standards.

To support this necessary safety measure, each member in an active category will be supplied with a new high-vis vest this season. They are due to arrive soon!

Delegations & Committees

The Nipper's Committee is an example of the successful distribution of responsibility, through an operational committee, to deliver all the elements of a large Director's portfolio. The Board aims to replicate this for each of our operational and administrative areas.

As part of the By-Laws review, the Board has resolved to formally establish and maintain a committee under each Director:

Operational Committees

- Lifesaving, chaired by the Director of Lifesaving
- Junior Development, chaired by the Director of Junior Development
- Surf Sports, chaired by the Director of Competition
- Member Transitions & Pathways, chaired by the Club Captain

Administrative Committees

- Finance, chaired by the Treasurer
- Compliance, chaired by the Secretary
- Facilities, chaired by the Director of Facilities
- Marketing, chaired by the Director of Marketing
- Fundraising, Functions & Events chaired jointly by the Director of Fundraising & Director of Functions
- Honours & Awards, chaired jointly by the Club Captain & Director of Member Services

Rather than centralising command and control, then seeing our people overburdened and burnt out, the Board is aiming to decentralise and actively distribute responsibility beyond the Directors. Engaging a wider group of members will provide transparency to the membership and enable all our members to contribute based on their skills, interests and time capacity. Callouts will be made by various Directors to assist with their committees, and you're encouraged to put your hand up where you can see an opportunity to contribute.

The Board has also resolved to formally establish three Special Standing Committees, which "...shall have a standing mandate to advise the Board, typically in relation to a specific area of criticality requiring continuity and specialist expertise". In plain language, this means that from time to time, when the Board needs to ask advice on a particular area from independent or specialist experts, these committees stand available to assist.

Following organisational governance best practice principles, the three Standing Special Committees established by the Board are:

- Audit Committee
- Risk Committee
- Governance Committee

The existing Audit & Risk Committee will be superseded by these, and that mandate distributed accordingly. Specific Terms of Reference are being drafted and a call-out will be made for members whose skills, expertise and experience can be engaged to support the Board. However, in the meantime if you have an interest in any of these areas, please reach out to Julian to discuss how you can contribute.



Facilities Report Jono Griffiths



We have had a busy lead up to summer at the Club, with some much-needed maintenance and cleaning completed. Thanks to our friends at Douglas Hire, and the hard work done by Tod, we have managed to clean all the gutters, wash most of the windows and get a good amount of painting done of the clubhouse's exterior. We still have a significant amount of the ground level that needs painting, so if anyone is willing and able to pick up a brush feel free to reach out! As we are located on the foreshore, our Club is vulnerable to corrosion - keeping on top of it moving forward will be the key.

We have also begun looking at some urgent repairs to the clubhouse to support the Club's need to have a space that can be effectively utilised for training, member hire and events. We have had some ongoing issues in the past with the AV not working as it should, so we have invested some time replacing most of the failed equipment and cabling, making the system more efficient and user friendly.

Paragon Electrical have also begun repairing our failed external lighting and we have managed to secure a donation of new LED flood lights to facilitate these works and reduce costs. This will ensure a safer space for our members during the darker periods by highlighting any important areas and reducing shadows. Ben and his team are doing a great job as normal and continue to do their best to look after our Club.

A skip will be delivered to the Club in the coming weeks to complete a much-needed clean-up of the site. It appears that there is a recurrence of people leaving items that are either rubbish or not fit for service around the Club. If we can please not do this, as this then becomes a labour-intensive task to remove the waste as well as a financial burden for the Club to get rid of it. It is likely that some of the accumulated rubbish is left by the public and not the fault of our members and this is something we are aware of.

With the start of the summer season and a likely increased use of the Club approaching, it would be great to tick a few more maintenance items off the list to ensure that we can all enjoy our facilities. If you have a particular skill, interest, or free time over the next few weeks, reach out to me, Michelle or Tod so that we can work together to improve the quality and enjoyment of our much-loved Club.



FUN FACT'

Have you seen our bell? Our bell sits proudly on our balcony facing the surf and was donated to the club in 1970 by Keith and Roy Batty from Albert Batty Metal Recyclers, after the original bell was lost in the fire of the original Surf Club. The bell would have been an iconic symbol of the Club, used to alert patrollers of a hazard or incident that was occurring.

The history of how the bell was donated is not clearly known, and we would love to know more about this item and how it became part of our history. If you know more let us know!





The easiest way to achieve this is to complete your online technical officials training and enrol in one of the practical sessions which have already been published by LSV. Get in early to make sure you can book a practical which is most convenient for your family.

Speaking from personal experience, having the bronze qualification and being a technical official put me right there in the water with the kids, seeing them overcome their challenges and the massive smiles that brings. I truly miss it and try to get in the water with any age group as much as I can. The same as being a technical official at carnivals it truly is the best seat in the house to watch your kids from.
