



In 1954, three Torquay SLSC members travelled by ship from Melbourne to Rome, after getting their bronze medallions and completing compulsory National Service training. They subsequently were to bump into a young South African born Bryce Courtenay, who was to become one of Australia's best-known authors, to influence him to migrate to Australia, and become his life-long mates.

lain Finlay, Noel White and Ron Kneebone worked around Europe, with time in ski resorts in Norway, with lain and Noel separating and heading south to find, and join, Bryce working in a copper mine in Rhodesia. They later lived together in the Australian Centre at Earls Court in London, frequenting the Down Under Club, with Bryce becoming convinced that Australians were good blokes, and eventually getting a return boat to Melbourne to meet up with his first wife.

lain returned earlier and was a journalist at the Torquay Olympic Surf carnival in 1956. Noel was to move to the US, and Ron competed for Torquay SLSC in the late 1950's in R&R and swam with the heroes of that time such as Alan Reid and Neil Inglis.

Bryce became an advertising guru, dreaming up the 'Mortein' ad with' Louey the Fly', and the 'slip/slop/slap' ad for sunscreen, before becoming an author of about 25 books including The Power of One which was made into a movie. He was awarded an AM and listed in the 10 best-known Australian authors.

PETER ORWIN

Our club is saddened to hear of the sudden death of the Torquay SLSC's eighth Club Captain Mr Peter Orwin. Peter was a local resident in Torquay, who is survived by his wife Noel, his children Anthony, Lisa, Prue and Camden and his grandchildren Rhys, Bhey, Dayne, Emily, Josh, Sam, Will, Mia and Ava.

Peter joined our club in the 1972 season. On the 18th March 1973 he passed the Bronze Examination and was the Competition Manager at the Aussie Championships at Dee Why NSW in 1975. At these Aussie Championships, the Torquay SLSC brought home 3 Gold Medals in the Craft events, a Silver Medal in the Taplin Relay and 3 Bronze Medals. From 1975 to 1977 Peter was a very committed Club Captain.




The Trust has great pleasure acknowledging a recent Bequest. Brian Beck, who passed away on 31/03/2023 left in his Will a bequest of \$200,000 to the Torquay SLSC Trust (Jack Harris Memorial). Brian has been a great supporter of the Trust having previously made generous

Brian joined TSLSC on 1/12/1949, gained his Bronze Medallion 8/01/1950 and patrolled for the club for many years. At the time of his death Brian had been a member for 74 years - the longest serving member of TSLSC.

Brian served the Club as Assistant Board and Ski Captain 1954/55 and Gear Steward for 5 seasons from 1993/94 - 1997/98. Not only did Brian serve on the committee but was a regular volunteer assisting the club when volunteers were called upon for carnival setups/shutdowns and club fundraising events.

Competitively Brain excelled as a ski paddler being the Victorian Single Ski Champion 1950, 51, 52, 54 and 55, Southern States Champion 1954 and partnered with Owen Yateman taking out the Victorian Double Ski Title in 1955 and 56. Brian was a Victorian Surf Life Saving Team Representative in 1951, 52 and 55. In Club Championships Brian took out the Single Ski Championship in 1950, 51, 52, 53 and 55, the Double Ski Championship (partnering with Owen) in 1951, 52, 53, 54 and 55 and the Club Point Shield in 1950.







STRATEGIC GOAL SETTING

As a club, particularly one with such rich sporting history, we should be acutely aware how critical goal setting and planning are to achieving success.

To know if we have been successful, we need to know what we were aiming to achieve in the first place. As this Surf Sun &Sand goes to press, the Board are working on our strategic goal setting for season 2023/24. The Directors have been presented with the seemingly simple questions:

WHAT DOES SUCCESS LOOK LIKE? IF WE WERE TO LOOK BACK ON THIS SEASON IN JUNE 2024, HOW WOULD WE DEFINE WHETHER IT HAS BEEN SUCCESSFUL OR NOT?

Planning for more than just being reactive on a day-to-day basis, the Board is attempting to set out some clear goals for the season, which we can then track, measure and report back to the members. These will appear in the next Surf Sun & Sand and we hope they will provide a positive focus and direction for our members to support and achieve together.



After some digging independently by Tony Fraser, Peter Doyle & Richard Greenhough, we have located digital copies of almost all the club's historic Annual Reports. Recognition must go to Gary Pettigrove for originally having the foresight to compile a set of these documents up to the mid-1990's, before they were lost to the sands of time, then to former president Peter Robinson (dec) for making digital copies for the future record.

The files are being assessed for compatibility by our technical wizard, Danny Phillips and we're hoping to shortly begin loading this important historical archive onto the club's website for all members to access and benefit from.

Off the back of this a comprehensive record of membership will be compiled, by extracting and consolidating the annual membership lists contained within each year's report. From there we will be able to better monitor and recognise important membership milestones and achievement which might otherwise go overlooked. We are looking forward to highlighting these through the season and including them in the 2023-24 Annual Report.



DELEGATIONS & COMMITTEES

From time to time, when the Board needs to ask advice on specialist areas or sensitive topics that are beyond its collective expertise, collective capacity or simply when they need an external review on a matter, it is important to have people with this knowledge available to assist. As part of the By-Laws review, following organisational governance best practice principles, it was resolved to formally establish and maintain three Special Standing Committees to support the Board, being:

- Audit Committee
- Risk Committee
- Governance Committee

Terms of Reference, the guiding principles for each Committee, have been agreed and are available for any member who requests a copy.

We are now looking for members whose skills, expertise and experience can be engaged to support the Board, and we ask that if you have an interest in any of these areas, please reach out to Julian to discuss how you can contribute.

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

I also wanted to take the opportunity to bring to you all some great news on the grants front. We have had two pieces of amazing news that I'd like to share and help spread the news on some of the activities that have both live and communicating with you now and some that you will see in the very near future.

Hvdrothon.

We have received money from the State Government and the Minister for Community Sport to promote girls and young women in sport. As female involvement in sport drops significantly amongst teenagers and early adults, and involvement in sport has proven benefits across mental health, healthy relationships and better health outcomes - we here at the club and the State Government have partnered to provide an all female surf clinic that is designed to both strengthen and sharpen the skills of females already involved in surf sports, but to also act as an introduction to surf sports for females perhaps new to the sport, curious and/or wanting to explore surf sports in an environment tailored particularly for females.

There will be a healthy dose of information provide by some seasoned female surf sports icons over the course of a dinner and Q&A session where girls and women can share, learn and bond over common themes which can then be strengthened on the beach and in the water over the course of the next day.

The funding from the government and time volunteered by our members means that we can subside the course heavily. It's being run by a trusted partner and this is the first time a course like this is being run in Victoria - the more people who register, the more surf icons can be brought and this will make the entire experience even better.

We'll also launch the program with an addition of rescue boards to provide a tangible benefit that goes along with all the extra karma we'll be generating.

When the program is successful we hope to launch the program across the rest of Victoria and Australia in yet another Torquay SLSC lead program. Let's go Team Torquay!


