PRESIDENT REPORT TONY WHITE

Well it was a big season with a lot on, a lot of new members joining; a lot of work to do and nobody came to serious grief between the flags between.

We started the year without a Secretary so I covered off that role as well as the Presidency for the first few months until Ben Maw put his hand up to help out. Ben's work commitments mean that he will be passing the baton on to someone else at the AGM but he left a couple of important legacies. One was a better structure for our meeting papers,

the other an initiative adopted by the board to acknowledge the traditional owners of the land before we commenced meetings. This might not be a big step in some people eye's but I was recently on a Naval exercise at a defence base where like every other Australian defence base the traditional owners of the land are recognised- so for much of modern Australia this acknowledgement is well accepted and it is time for our organisation too.

Our new website developed by Fleur Batties is a much improved effort and we need to keep at that as well as our social media effort to ensure that we go where our members are going to get their information and engage with the world.

Scott Tannahill as Lifesaving Director has brought many years' experience elsewhere into the role and has been supported in the training effort by many hours of work by Pat Spinazzola. Alan Dell was good enough to put his hand up to fill the Club Captain role and when he wasn't helping out with just about anything he, importantly, provided an important link for the current board with many older members of the club. Ken Godfrey helped out with that role as well and also helped stop the building rot away into the sea as Director of Facilities. He did that, by the way, notwithstanding major surgery and getting speared by a stingray.

Our Competition Director Peter Quinlan put in many hours by the beach in support of our young athletes and our Treasurer, Katrina Spinazzola, put in many hours also behind the keyboard keeping our finances on the straight and narrow.


Scott McCardel has worked miracles in the nipper section assisted by an army of volunteers who bring new skills and enthusiasm to the club. We had 333 nippers all up – I hope all those kids had fun, felt safe and valued and will keep coming back for many years to come.

Thanks also to our staff, caretaker Damian Horan and all the casual staff who represent the club at many functions.

As the season comes to a close, we have hit an all-time record in terms of numbers with more than 1000 members, we have seen some great results at State and National titles and our lifesavers have done the job they train for. More of our lifesavers have gone on to gold medallion training in the last few years than has been the case for a while and their lifeguarding as well as our surf sports help build relationships up and down the coasts with other clubs and communities. We are still one of the only movements that brings people of every gender and every age together.

The winner of the President's award this year Elisa Hall exemplifies much that is good about the club and the movement. Despite being only 14 she has qualified for her Surf Rescue Certificate and contributed 102 hours on patrol over the season (only 90 minutes less than her big brother Liam).

This year we have done all this with vacant roles with directors of fundraising and functions and a few difficulties filling other roles. We did it in an environment that has more and more red tape – much of it justified. We did it because surf lifesaving is a good thing to have, a good thing to do and a good way to hang out with your friends and their families. Most important of all we achieved whatever we achieved due to the thousands of hours our members have volunteered in every way possible, and I thank every single one of them for the contribution they made.

How things change in such a short period of time. All new faces except one on the committee, It is healthy to have change which brings in new ideas because my thoughts are that four years is getting close to burnt out,

After a shaky start the committee has worked well in their areas with the nipper area growing in numbers, lifesaving training with more awards, boats doing what they do best winning races around the country and patrols have been of a good standard. Senior competition has struggled for numbers but those in senior competition team performed well. Two new coaches were

appointed and worked well as a team.

Have had a few disappointments being the lack of the club combining as one for social events, the main one was the lack of numbers for the annual door knock. Sixteen attended on the first attempt which was a disgrace for a club with a 1000 members. The club needs funds as there are bills to be paid during the winter months as well. The door knock is an event where we can all get together with the older members taking out the younger members to knock on the doors and all return back to the club for a BBQ. Presently the sections are happy to be segregated from each other. This is not what we should be doing. We are all members of the best club and we should be getting together, for comp training, BBQ's and the odd pre season working bee as there are always plenty of things to do, that can be done by the members instead of paying someone to do it, because every dollar saved is more money for equipment. This happened in January when members volunteered to open the bar every night and a large amount was made because there was no wages to pay.

Life Members and older members held a few events that raised several thousands of dollars to put towards competitors to help them get equipment and travel to the National Titles. These were well attended by the boat section but no other sections were willing to help out. If competitors are not willing to help raise funds there will be no assistance to help purchase equipment. I hate comparing times, but back in the 90's we would send 40 competitors to the "Aussies" with the competitors paying only their fares to get to the titles, with the team staying in 4 star accommodation and meals, which the club would finance because of the fundraising done by all during the year.

Scott Tannahill put together the patrol roster which needed a little twitching to be able to have qualified members on each patrol. This is getting a little easier with the present group of active members gaining extra awards. The inter patrol was again introduced with success with patrol that I assessed were of a good standard. To the following members who attend all their rostered patrols, well done.

Mel is an exceptional Captain and Managers her Patrols like clockwork.

Much thanks to the Jack Harris Trust for the continued support of our Surf Lifesaving section. By way of recognition of the Trust's support, the Committee have agreed to from now on regard the winning Patrol to be titled The Jack Harris Trust Patrol of the Year.

One of my aims this year was to encourage members to feel like they owned the club and treat the club and their rostered Patrols as such. All in all, I think we have come a long way with this. Most Patrols were well attended and the Patrol Shed, First Aid Room and IRB Shed were normally left tidy.

Special thanks to Yann Gibert who not only clocked up the most Patrol hours with a total of 127 but was our First Aid Manager who was on hand for many of our First Aid cases and kept the room stocked and spotless.

Also thanks to Damian Horan who not only is our live in Caretaker, but found himself in the midst of many serious First Aid calls and also carried out 60 Patrol Hours.

Our Bronze Camp was again a huge success. Thanks for the coordination by Pat Spinazzola and his hard working group of Trainers. Most of the group again came together later in the season to train up another group from St Kevins College. In total we gained 75 new Bronze Medallion holders and a varst majority of them have gone on to Patrol our Beach.

Next season we can look forward to a new fully funded Digital Radio system and an upgrade to our IRB Motors. With that in mind, I would like to encourage members to coincided taking on a couple of roles we have not have filled for a few years. If anyone is interested in taking on the role of Power Craft Officer and Gear Steward, I ask that you please contact myself and I can explain the role description.

Moving forward, I have put forward a proposal to the Committee that we merge the roles of Lifesaving Director and Club Captain. Each of these roles are mixed with the same and similar job descriptions and as we do not currently have a Chief Instructor, we are planning on reintroducing this much needed role to take Lifesaving Directors spot and introduce the Director of Training and Assessment.

I have enjoyed my last two years in this position and thank all our Active Members for their commitment continuing to help make our Great Beach Safe.



BRONZE CAMP/AWARDS TRAINING REPORT

What a season it was!

Bronze Camp was probably the most successful and smooth camp I have been involved in. 19 candidates qualified for their Bronze Medallion. Whilst this was a significant decrease on last years camp of 49, it must be said that 12 enrolled participants withdrew for a variety of reasons unrelated to TSLSC in the 3 weeks prior to the camp commencing. All

participants have attended patrols, with Gabi Zmijarevic being the leading patroller with 55 hours completed. With 49 enrolled in 2016, we are still finding the ideal balance, with a group of 36 suggested as the ideal number for 2018.

This year also saw the introduction of a formalised progression structure through the club, to pro- vide participants and their parents with a degree of certainty and ownership over how to gain life saving awards and go on to instruct on Bronze Camp, with an emphasis on aspiring and working towards becoming senior members of the club. In years previous, progress was haphazard and inconsistent. It has required a focus on the

long term by the instruction team, and a shift to a 'we, not me' attitude, thinking of bringing through the next generation of leaders at Torquay SLSC.

This new structure involved the introduction of a trial 'Silver Camp' - a development program for returning Bronzies, where they gain several life saving awards. 15 returning Bronzies from 2015 and 2016 participated in Silver Camp, and all reported a very positive experience, with many keen to instruct on Bronze Camp and take up leadership roles in the future. Participants trained for and received their IRB Crew, Spinal

Management and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques [AID] awards during the week, with some who had already completed the IRB Crew course beginning training for the IRB Drivers award. We have had great feedback about Silver Camp from participants and parents, and various changes will be made next year to reflect that.

Bronze Camp Continued

Of course, none of this happens without dedicated instructors and assessors, who spend weeks planning, revising, and assisting with camp set up and logistics. To all of you - THANK YOU. With the addition of several new evening activities for Bronze Camp,

I believe the camp is at its strongest position yet, with a team of instructors who will makethis camp successful going on into the future. However - recruitment is essential. The club cannot rely on ONLY former Nippers coming through the ranks, as to both make our training and assessment activities financially viable and to fill patrols, we need new members coming in at the Bronze Camp stage. I encourage all interested in attending Bronze Camp in 2018 to consider bringing along a few friends new to surf life saving. We cultivated successful relationships with two C schools - Surf Coast Secondary College and St. Kevin's College, Toorak. Surf Coast Secondary College incorporated a Bronze Medallion program as part of their Sport and Recreation studies, and 11 students from the school went on to obtain their Bronze Medallion, under the watchful eve of Keith Millar, St. Kevin's organised a week-long camp component. I'd particularly like to thank all of the instructors, assessors, and water safety on this camp, as I was unexpectedly hospitalised and had surgery the day prior to camp starting. The way that all of the instructors and assessors stepped up to run the camp smoothly was nothing short of faultless, and it shows great promise for the future. The feedback from the teaching staff and school was nothing short of glowing. 31 students from St. Kevin's College received their Bronze Medallion, and the school has already booked in for 2019. Excellent work! The club is very interested in any other secondary schools that would like to develop a relationship, please contact me if you have any leads.

On the advanced awards front, we ran several extra courses over the season, including 2 x ART courses, a November Adult Bronze, a Flexible Delivery First Aid Course, a winter IRB Drivers Course, and 2 x IRB Crew training courses. We will be revisiting how some of these courses are delivered in 2018/19 to better spread the load amongst our instructors and assessors.

A big congratulations to Will Popovic, who received the inaugural Training and



Assessment Award. This award goes to a member who has obtained the most new surf life saving awards, whilst also demonstrating a commitment to the life saving movement in general. Will was a participant on Silver Camp who went above and beyond, assisting with courses later in the season, and obtaining his Silver Medallion Beach Management (at Jan Juc) and First Aid awards alongside the other awards. He combined this with patrolling over 50 hours and his competition commitments in the Under 19 Boat Crew.

I'd also like to recognise the efforts of our team at the 'Aussies'. Not only are they dedicated, hard working competitors; every single one of our athletes at the Aussies has obtained at least one new surf life saving award, either this season or last. Many of them also assist by training new surf life savers or other advanced award training, by attending Silver Camp, or by taking leadership roles on patrols. They are great role models formembers coming through - if they can do it, so can you!

Finally, I'd like to thank Scott Tannahill for his assistance and guidance throughout the season, and Daryl Moss and Deb Lowe from LSV for all of their help!

The LSV U15 Leadership Camp was an overall amazing experience and I would highly recommend to apply to anyone who is passionate about their club/surf life saving, interested in leadership or just wanting to meet and interact with new people.

Over the weekend, I learnt so much about myself and the people in the world around me. I got to explore the different personality types in a workshop, and then apply that knowledge to group initiatives. The workshop was really interesting; as I got to hear about the different personalities of others in my group and watch them open up and be vulnerable, sharing their strengths and weaknesses. This was also a huge step for me to do so too. Through this, I was able to see the other people on my camp as more than just group members; I was able to have an idea at who they were and how they think. THE 2018 SURF COAST TIMES JIM WALL IRONMAN TERRY WALL

The 56th running of the Jim Wall event was held at Torquay on Friday, January 12th. Originally called a Surfathon (before the Term Ironman was used) it is the world's first and longest running ironman event-which includes a run, board, ski and swim legs.

This year the day also included 16 individual races sponsored by club members with the ironman and women

events supported by the Surf Coast Times, these preceded by a segment of the Weiland Shield competition between California and Victoria. It started as a dreary day, with the long early races at high tide, and with the spectacle of the colourful shelters of the many local and interstate clubs and Victorian and Californian teams filling the grassy mound. Some 230 athletes participated, with 65 in the ironman and 50 in the ironwoman events finishing the day at lowish tide, a bit of sun, and fortunately by passed by an electrical storm. A small swell created interest with craft waves from the point, a few body waves and the complexity of the Torquay rocks at low tide.

The men's event was won by Matt Bevilacqua from Kurrawa, the women's by Manly's Naomi Scott, with the M-shaped course giving spectators a closer look at the field and the starting run past the surf club along the sea wall associated with cheering supporters. The awards for best Victorian went to Archie Vernon of Torquay and Sophie Thomas of Warrnambool. With eight qualifying places to the Summer of Surf Ocean 6 event at Fairhaven on the following Sunday, there were fantastic and close finishers. Torquay competitors included some of the up-and-comers - with some results-including,

Archi Vernon (U19 Swim 4th, Board 5th), Grace Harris (U19 Board, 1st, swim 7th), Ben Harris (U19 board final), Michael Tass and Jayden Schram.

This was one of the best Jim Wall days I have seen, the races were exciting, it run well and the club should be rightly proud. Ironman hero and coach Wes Berg (who coached Joel Parkinson to his world surfing title) has been coming down from the Gold Coast to the Jim Wall for more than a decade said, "This has been another fantastic event and day, we will be back!"

The club ran the event without LSV involvement, and a number of members contributed tirelessly throughout the day, the ones I saw included Peter Quinlan, Bill Johnson, Tony White, Brian Thomas and Scotty Tannahill- there were many others manning the BBQ,

managing the presentations and helping out on the beach. The club raised some \$15,000, a most satisfactory outcome. Discussions after included suggestions to expand encouragement for locals to participate and also for a new perpetual trophy shaped by Jeff Sweeney. On a personal note, can I thank all involved to continue the successful running of the annual Jim Wall Ironman at Torquay - see you again next year.

As always the list of minor and major repairs never end, the following items have been achieved this season.

- 1. Complete removal and replacement of new gas instantaneous wall mounted HWS (Hot Water Systems) which will see us through many years to come, the cost of this was over \$17,000
- 2.Badly deteriorating steel to front balcony off main hall has been descaled and painted with appropriate galvanised paint products including sections of the rear
- balcony BBQ area off the main bar.
- 3. Badly rusting steel handrail to bunkroom, rear access stair removed re galvanised and replaced
- 4. Large balcony off bunkroom overlooking beach soffit to ceiling started to collapse, it was found to be asbestos this was completing removed and replaced with appropriate sheeting, painting was done by Damien Horan.
- 5. Loose sheets above rear BBQ area has been refixed.
- Considerable work has been done to remove dangerous lighting which could have caused a fire throughout the buckrooms at a of \$1960.00 also replacement of some exit lights and reposition of lighting to close to fire alarm sensors. Work carried out by Ben Dubberley, Paragon Electricians.
- New roof and security gates installed to protect new HWS
- 8. Bright yellow edges has been installed to edge of external stairs from balcony to lawn area for safety requirements
- 9. Considerable printing has been carried out to clean up walls in outside kitchen area, carried out by *caretaker "Jack of all trades"* Damien Horan.
- 10. Male and female toilet downstairs doors and jambs badly in need of repair. They have now been replaced with fibre glass coated doors and new jambs.

We need to keep the building in good repair so we can hire it out for weddings and parties





He was quick to contribute to the club gaining his Surf Bronze on the 24th March 1968 and his Instructors Certificate on 24th November 1968. He served for three years on the recently formed Associate Committee 1968 to 1971. During the period he took on the arovous task of Chief Instructor for two years 1969/1971. His efforts during those two years were particularly noteworthy, the club having been destroyed by fire in July 1970. Leaving him no clubrooms to operate from however the various awards were still carried out meticulously.

Stepping down as Chief Instructor he then served as Gears Steward for nine years 1972 to 1977, then 1981 to 1985. Max was elected Club President for two terms 1979 to 1981. Despite all of his other activities he was Power Boat Captain for seven years 1974 to 1981 and as a member of the Board of Examiners (appointed to the Board in 1979) he instructed and examined members from nearby clubs in the operation of Power Crafts.

Max's club awards included member of our club State March Past Champions in 1970, Best Clubman award 1974/75, State Council Best Gear Steward award 1975/76. For his outstanding service over a lengthy period Max was elected a Life Member in 1985

A fine record by a royal, dedicated member, who served his club with great distinction.

Ester Pittard

Mrs Ester Pittard, widow of former club President and Life Member Harry, died peacefully on 24th October 2017. Ester was an original member of the Ladies Social Group and later the Ladies Auxiliary. The many functions held at Torquay and Melbourne were most entertaining and a source of much needed funds. The work of Ester and fellow Lady Auxiliary members during the building and refurbishing the new club house during 1970/71/72 was a commitment of generous proportion.

Ester was in her 58year with the club having received a 50 year Membership Medal in 2010.

David Brownlee

David (known in surfing circles as "WhipLash") Brownlee died during November 2017 aged 90 years. He joined in December 1952, gained his Surf Bronze in April 1953 and was a competent patrol member from 1953 to 1970.

David served on the committee as Publicity Officer and Editor of the club magazine (Surf, Sun & Sand) from 1963 to 1968. He then turned his talents as a Member of the Board of Examiners attending surf carnivals and Bronze Examinations around the state coastline for nigh on 30 years, having resigned from the club in1972. He took up membership a few years ago to support his grand children.


